Unit 3: The Good News of God, the Gospel

UNIT OVERVIEW

Gospel means “good news.” In the Bible, the gospel is the good news that God sent His Son Jesus to save sinners like you and me from the punishment we deserve for our sins. That salvation is ours when we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus as our own Savior. Now that is good news indeed!

In this unit we will learn four ways the gospel is such good news.

Unit Big Question (and Answer): What Is the Gospel? It's Salvation through Faith in Jesus Christ!

Unit Bible Verse: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16, ESV

Bible Truth 1 Concept: Salvation through Faith in Jesus Christ...God Made Us and We Should Obey Him

Who made the world and everything in it? God did! He made it perfectly, back in the very beginning! Everything He made was good. There was no sin in it. It was all just exactly as He planned.

Not only did God make us and the world we live in, He rules over it all. He takes care of us and keeps the world going. He gives us good laws to live by--and consequences if we disobey Him. God is our good King. He knows what is best for us and wants us to live that way. We should worship, love and obey Him.

Bible Truth 1 Bible Verse: Psalm 100:1-6, ESV

"Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth! Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the LORD, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise!"

Learn a Little: "Know that the LORD, he is God! It is he who made us."

Meaning:

God is the good King and Creator of us all. God's people love to praise Him and tell Him how much they love Him and how wonderful He is. They are so happy to be His people who He cares for and loves. They thank Him for being so good to them.

Because God's people are so happy about being His people, it's not enough for them to quietly worship Him. They want to make a joyful noise and sing loudly to Him. They want everyone--the whole earth--to praise God along with them. They want them to gather together with them at church and sing, sing, sing to the LORD, the great and good king!

Bible Truth 1 ACTS Prayer

- A** God, we praise You for being the good Creator and King of the world.
- C** We confess that many times we rebel against You and Your good ways. We choose to live life our own way, instead. We need a Savior!
- T** Thank You for being our good Creator and King. Thank You for making everything in the world for Your good purposes. Thank You for being so merciful to us! Thank You for offering us salvation through Jesus, when we repent of our sins and trust Jesus as our Savior.
- S** God, work in our hearts. Help us to turn away from rebelling against You. Help us to trust in Jesus as our Savior. Help us to joyfully obey You, our good and great King. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

The Case of the God Who Was Different*Acts 17:16-33***Story-telling Tips**

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Practice telling story with expression. Look for words that might be new to your children. Plan to explain the meaning of them to the children. The numbers in the story correspond to elements of the picture. Practice pointing to the pictures as you read the story. Shorten the story, if necessary, for your child/group of children.
3. If desired, choose a listening assignment for the children (listed below). Listening with a purpose helps the children keep focused and glean more from the story. The three, different assignments allow you to re-tell the story three times with fresh purpose. Answers to the listening assignments are found at the end of the story.

During your presentation:

1. If you are telling the story to a group of children, maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story. Tell the story with enthusiasm and expression. Take time to show each story scene to the children as you tell it. Use the cue numbers in the story to highlight corresponding parts of the picture as you tell the story.
2. The Clue Catcher question at the bottom of each scene helps the children keep engaged with the story.
3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.
5. At end of the story, repeat the listening assignment question and ask for answers. Close in prayer.

“Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth! Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the LORD, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise!”

I need to find out:

- 1. Who urged people to worship the LORD and serve Him as their king?**
- 2. Who did worship Him? Who did not?**

Detective Dan’s Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found six clues, but only 4 of them are in the story.

They are: a camera; a temple; a stone altar; a sword; the world; and, laughing people.

Hold each of them up for the children to see as you identify them.

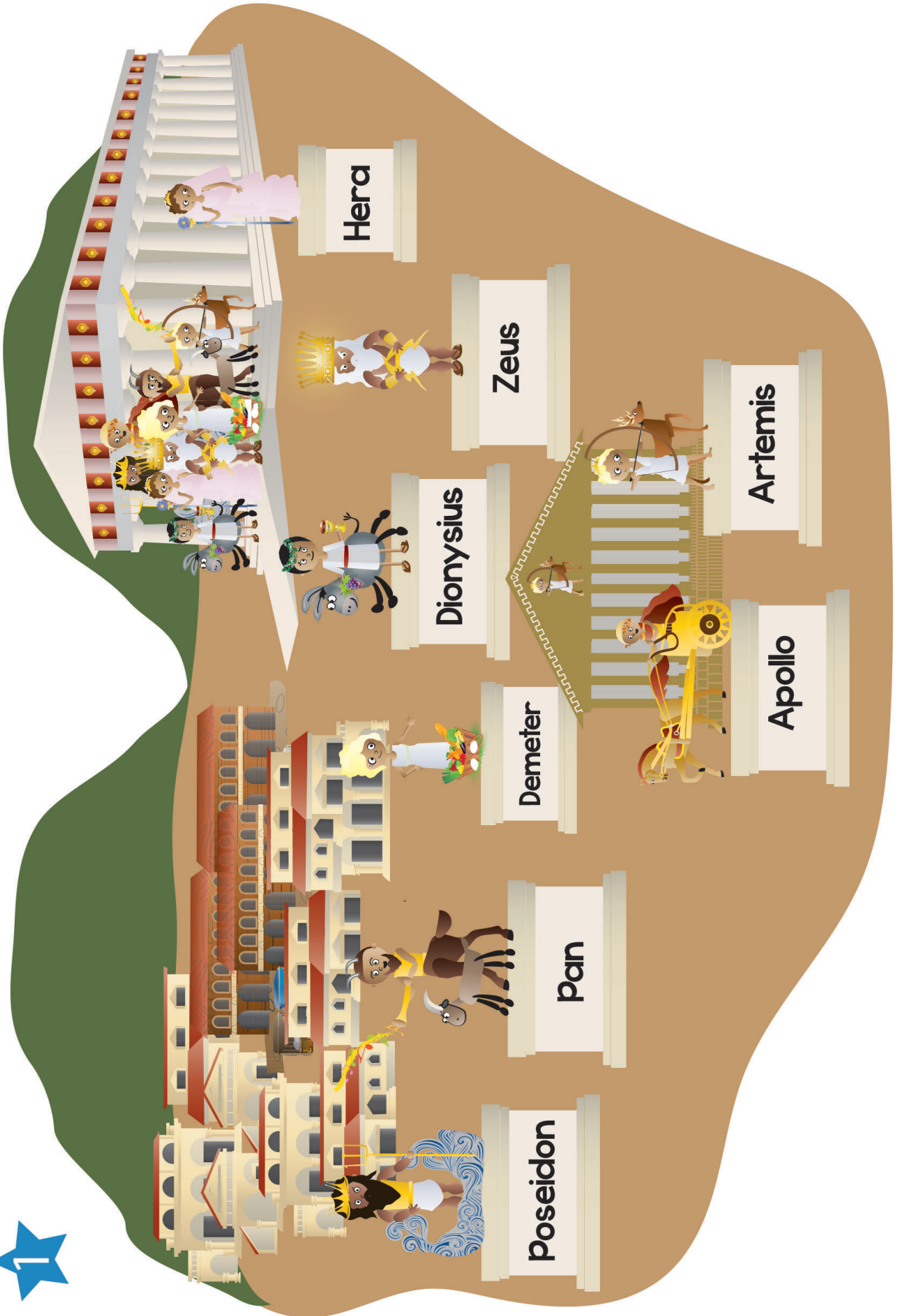
I need to figure out:

- 1. Which four belong in the story and which two don’t?**
- 2. What did the people of Athens need to confess to the LORD? Did any do this?**

Read the assignment questions, THEN SAY,

“Ok, Deep Down Detectives! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan’s questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions.”

*Read the Bible Truth story, answer questions, present the gospel and lead in prayer.**Answers to questions; the gospel; and, ACTS prayer are included with the story text.*

You might not know these names, but the people of Athens certainly did. And these were just a FEW of the HUNDREDS of gods they worshipped! Wow!

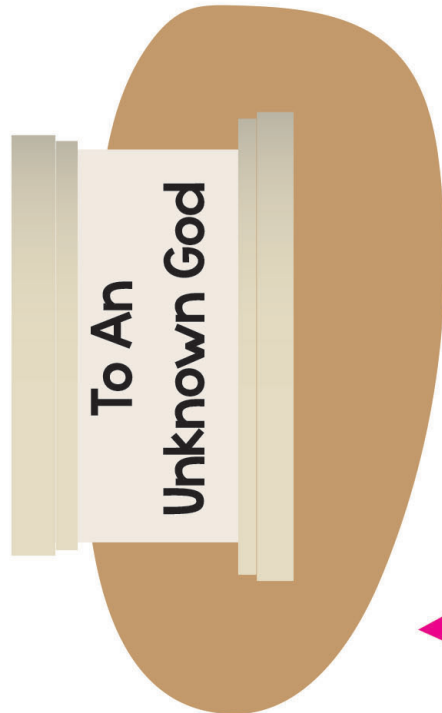

The people of Athens took good care of their gods.

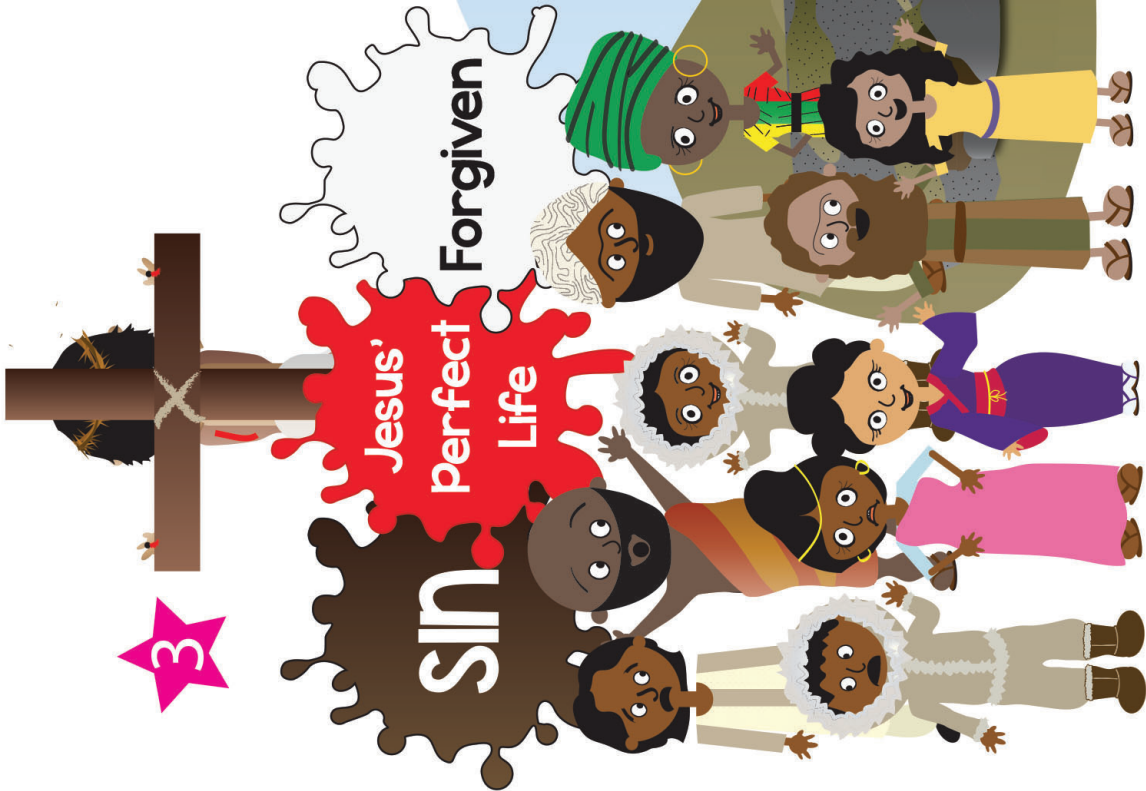
- 1 They built them beautiful temples. They laid rich worship gifts at their stony feet.

Yes, the people of Athens worshipped hundreds of gods; but, the only god they SHOULD have been worshipping was that  "Unknown God."

He was the REAL, the one, true God! Not many people in Athens knew His name, but I think you do.

Can you tell me His name?

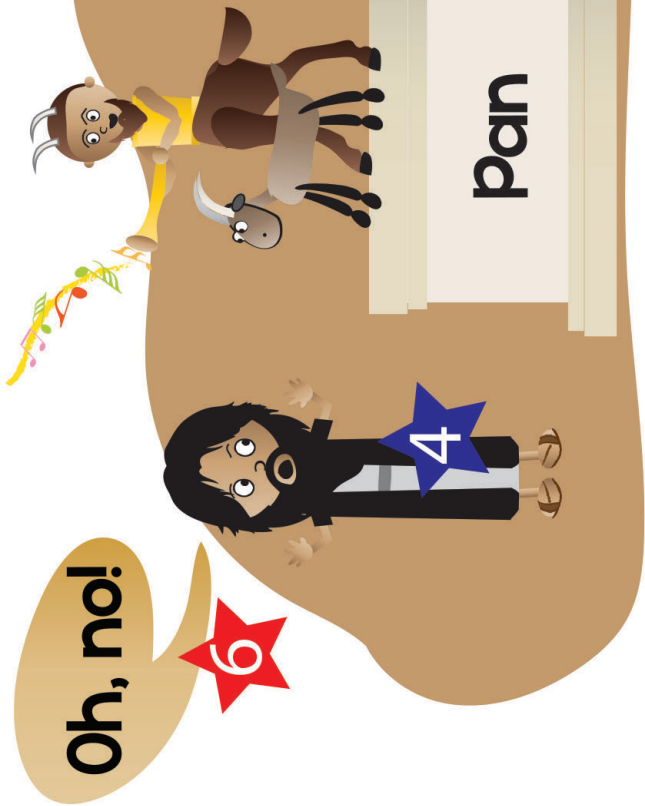
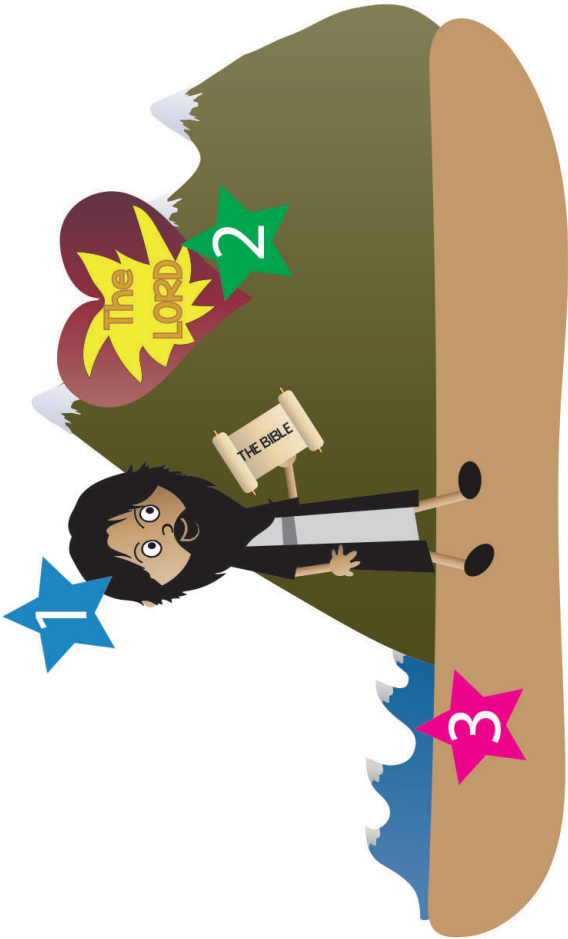
It was  the LORD!

He was God the Father who sent  His Son Jesus to be our Savior. He sent  His Holy Spirit to live inside those who trusted in Jesus as their Savior. He made the way for us to become His people forever.

Story Scene 4

Maybe most of the people in Athens didn't know about the one, true God, but there was (👉) a man named Paul who did. Paul knew the LORD and (👈) loved the LORD and lived for the LORD. He trusted in Jesus, His Son, as his Savior. He had the Holy Spirit living in his heart.

And if there was ONE thing that Paul wanted to do with his life, it was to tell others how they could know and love and live for the LORD...and trust in Jesus as their Savior, too.

👉 So... across the sea, over mountains, and down through valleys went Paul, telling everyone he could about the LORD and how they could know Him through Jesus.

One day, 👉 all this traveling led Paul to a city he had never been to before.

Can you guess the name of this new city?

It was Athens!

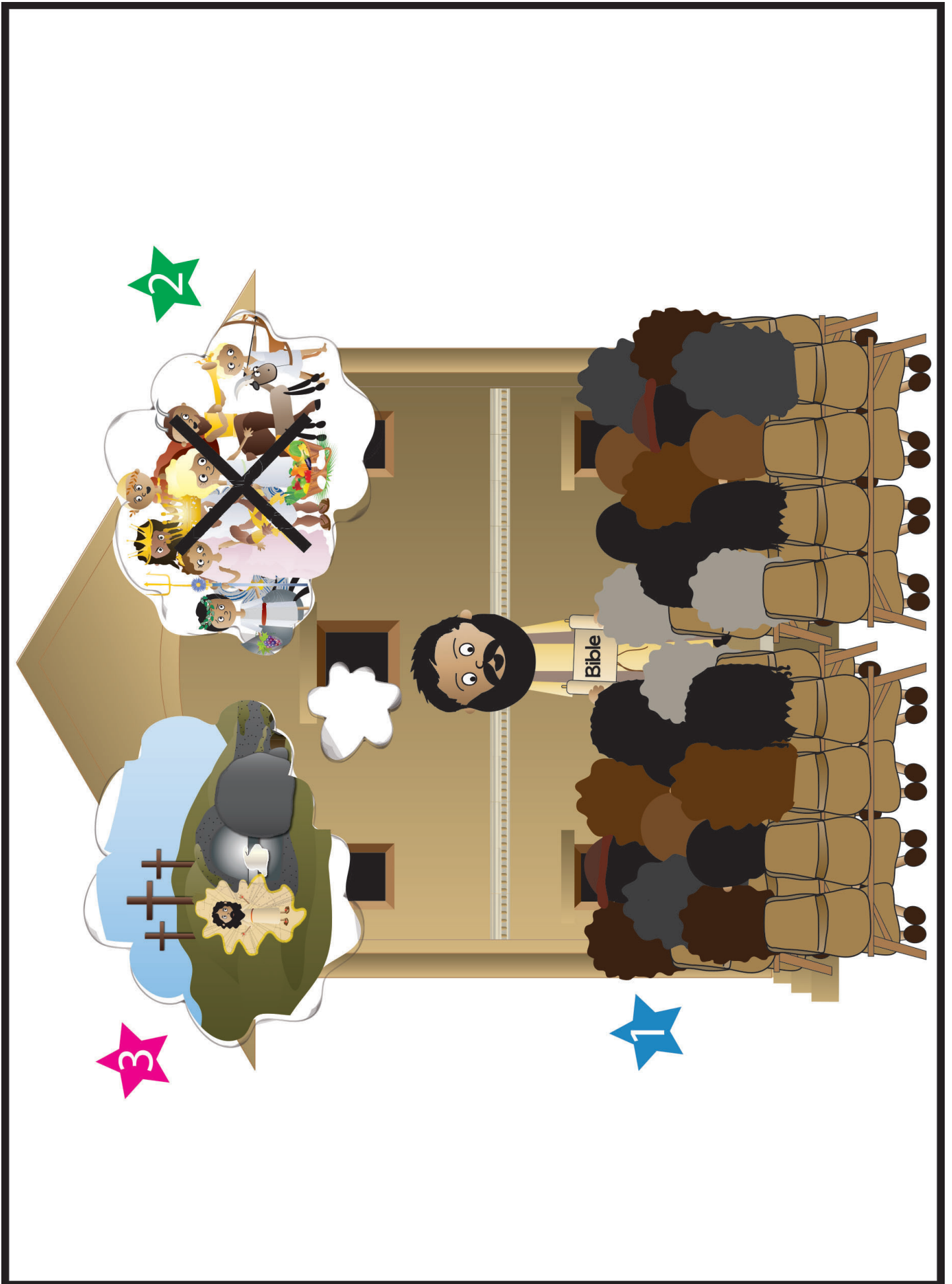
Now Paul had been to many cities that were SMALLER than Athens. And Paul had been to cities that were BIGGER than Athens. But there was something that Paul saw in Athens that he had NEVER seen before in any of those other cities--big or small. 👉 It was this many fake gods!

Clue Catchers: Can you find Paul preaching from the Bible?



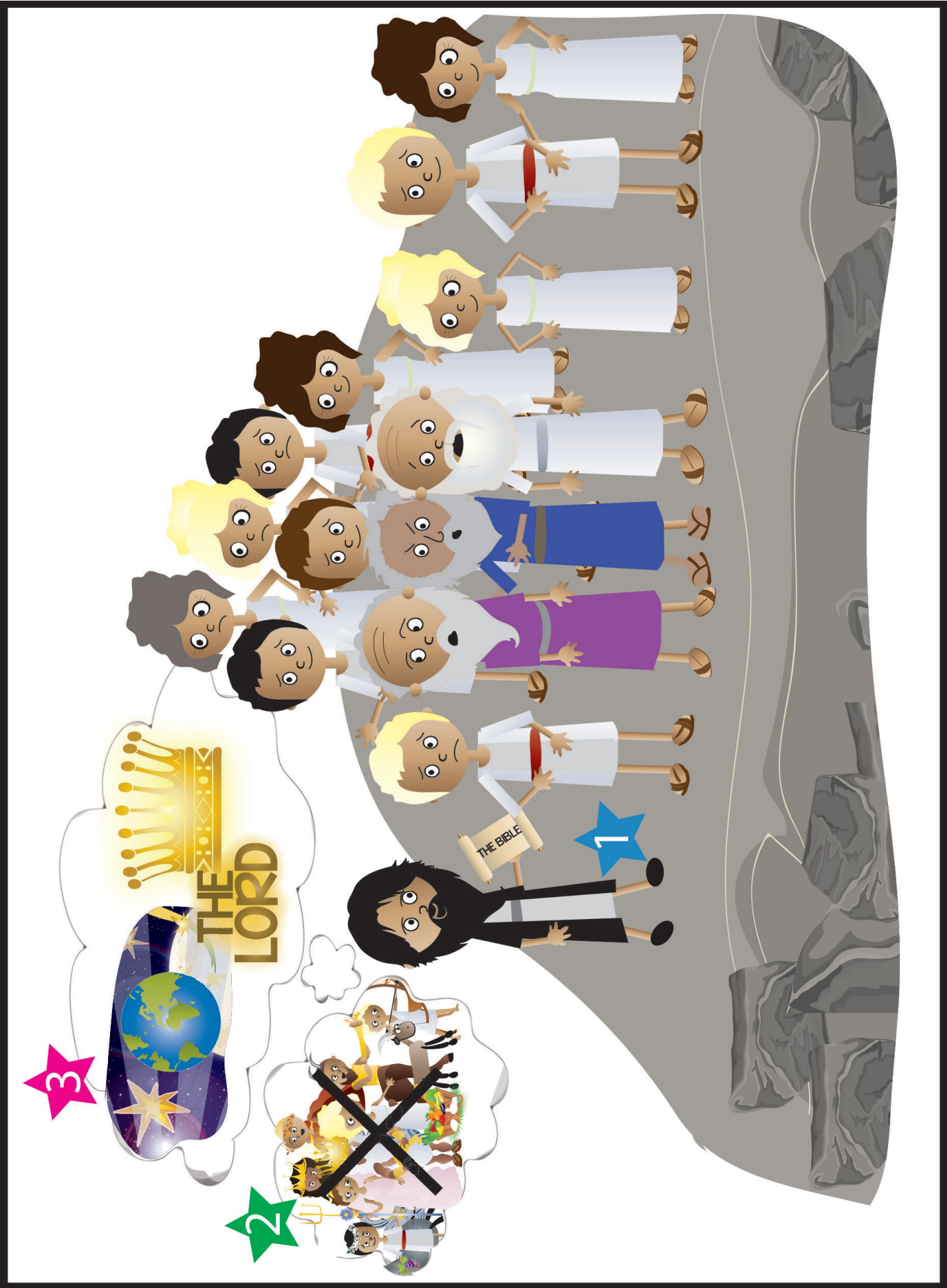
Story Scene 6

Then down by the temples and  into the marketplace, went  Paul. “Let me tell you about the LORD! Let me tell you about  Jesus, His Son, sent to save you! Worship Him,  not these fake gods!” Paul urged  everyone who would listen.

Word about Paul and his strange, new teaching soon spread through the city and  to the city leaders.

They found Paul and said, “Come up to our important meeting place on Mars Hill and tell us about this new god. We want to hear about him, ourselves.”

So up, up, up  the big, stony hill called Mars Hill went Paul with the city leaders and many others. How excited Paul was to tell them about the real, one, true God and His Son Jesus! He hoped they would put their trust in Him!

On top of Mars Hill, Paul spoke to the crowd. “People of Athens, what a lot of gods you worship! he exclaimed.

“ But you are worshipping the wrong one! I’ve come to tell you about the one, true God--the one you call ‘the Unknown God.’ His name is  the LORD. He’s the one you should worship. He’s the one who made heaven and earth and everything in it,” Paul told them.

“Your city is filled with the big temples you built to worship your gods, but the LORD is too great to live inside even your biggest temple!” Paul exclaimed.



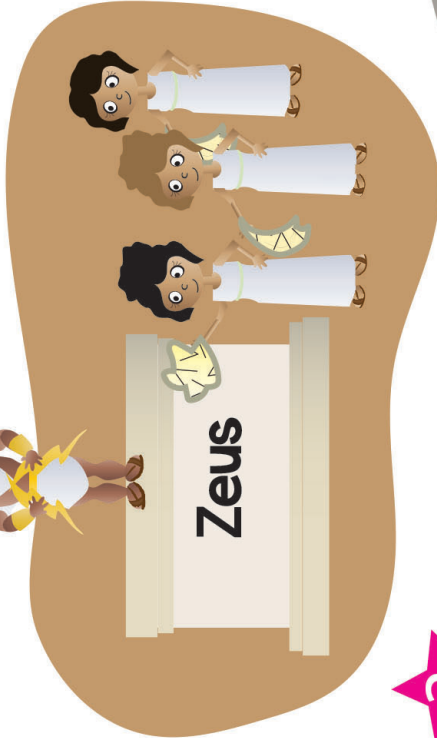

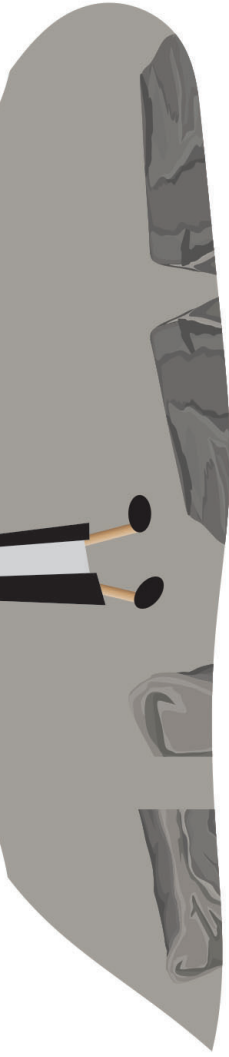

“You bring  worship gifts to take care of your gods. You  honor them with worship parties.  You keep them looking bright and shiny. You make sure they don’t fall over.

But the LORD doesn’t need people to take care of Him,” Paul explained. “ He’s the living God...He takes care of Himself...and all of us, too! He made us and gave us life.”





Story Scene 9

“**1** The LORD is our king and we should obey Him and His good laws; but, the sad news is that we don’t.
2 We have all disobeyed Him and deserve His punishment for our sins,” Paul told them.

“But the LORD is so merciful that He made the way for us to be forgiven.” Paul explained.

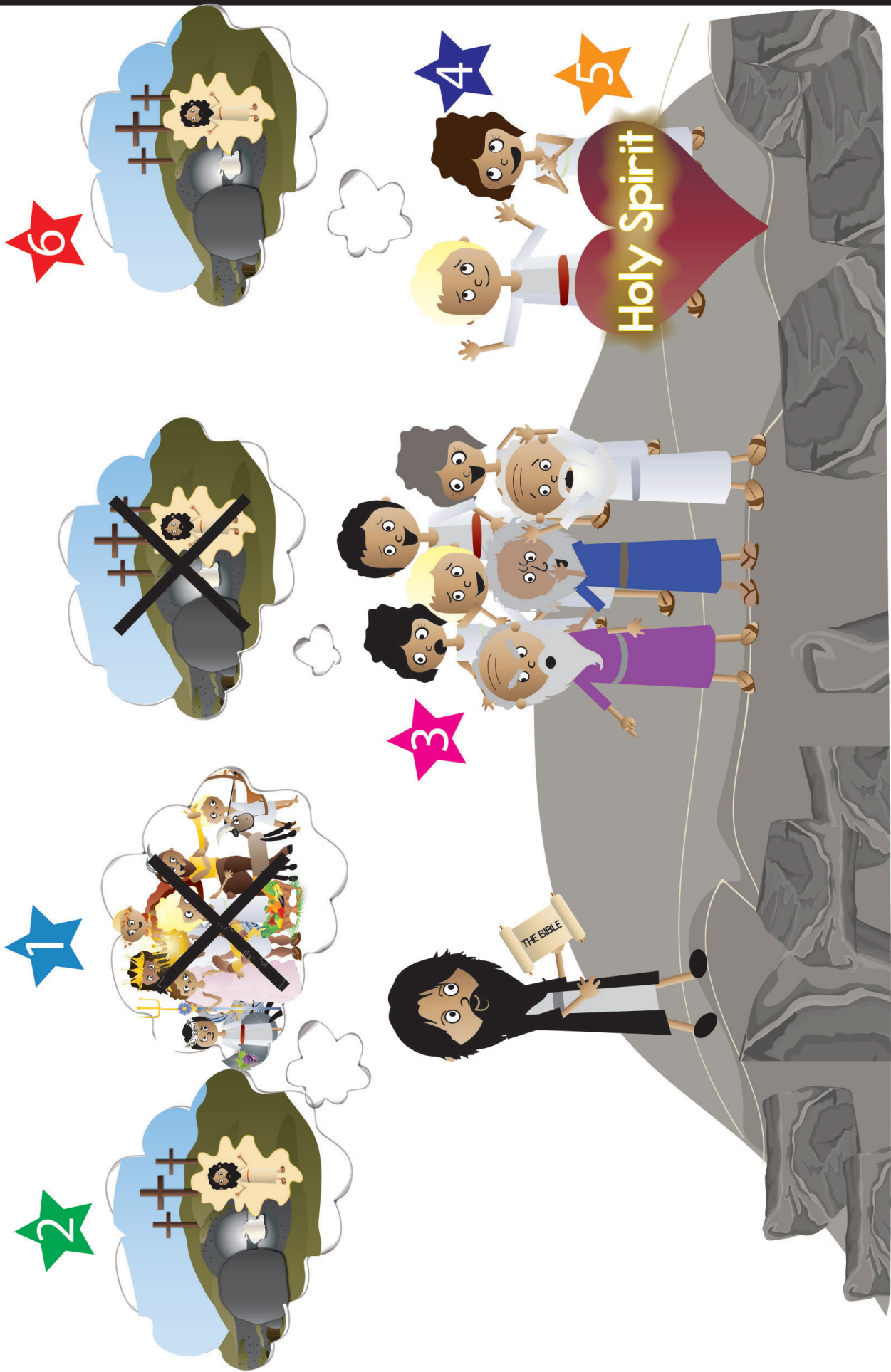
Who did God send so we could be forgiven, do you know His name?

“**3** God sent His Son Jesus to suffer and die on the cross to pay for sins. On the third day, He raised up Jesus from the dead in victory.

Now **4** all who turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior can be saved. They can be God’s people and have eternal life with Him,” Paul told them.

Story Scene 10

“So  turn away from worshipping your fake gods. Turn to LORD.  Trust in His Son Jesus and be saved! You can be God’s people, too,” Paul urged them.

What do you think the people of Athens will do? Will they believe in the LORD or not?

The people of Athens hardly knew what to think. They had never heard of a god like this!

A god who was supposed to be greater than Zeus, the king of their gods; yet, who came to die for sinners... then rose from the dead! Incredible!

 Many people laughed. “Ha, ha! Your god sounds silly! Who would ever believe in him?” they said.

But others,  like Dionysius and Damaris, went to Paul to hear more. As Paul talked,  God’s Holy Spirit worked in their hearts. He helped them turn away from their sins and  trust in Jesus as their Savior.

How happy Paul was! Maybe there still were many fake gods in Athens, but now there was a little group of believers living there, who could keep on telling others the good news of Jesus.

Cracking the Case:

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson 1 Listening Assignment:

1. Who was the god who was different? The LORD was the god who was so different.

2. What made Him so different? He was the one, true, living God. He was no fake god, like those the people of Athens worshipped.

For You and Me:

The people of Athens worshipped many gods, but only the LORD was the one, true God who created them and they should obey. Paul told the people of Athens how they could know the LORD as their God, by turning away from worshipping their fake gods and trusting in Jesus as their Savior.

Detective Dan's Lesson 2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible Verse is: Psalm 100:1-6

"Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth. Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs. Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name."

1. Who urged the people to worship the LORD and serve Him as their king? Paul did.

2. Who did worship the LORD? Who did not? Dionysius and Damaris and a few others worshipped the LORD. The rest laughed and kept worshipping their fake gods.

For You and Me:

Like the people of Athens, we have so much to worship the LORD for being and doing. He is the one, true God! He has made us and wants us to know Him and love Him. He has offered us to be saved from our sins through Jesus, just like the people of Athens heard.

Detective Dan's Lesson 3 Listening Assignment:

Our six clues were: a camera; a temple; a stone altar; a sword; the world; and, laughing people.

1. Which four belong in our story?

The temple; stone; world; and laughing people.

2. What did the people of Athens need to confess to the LORD? Did any do this?

The people of Athens needed to confess that they had worshipped fake gods, not the LORD, the one, true God. They needed to trust in Jesus as their Savior. Dionysius, Damaris and others did this.

For You and Me:

Like Damaris and Dionysius, we should also confess our sins to God. Perhaps we have not worshipped fake gods like they did, but we have all disobeyed God and lived our own way. We all deserve His punishment. But, if we confess our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior, God will forgive us and make us His people, just like He did for Dionysius and Damaris, long ago.

The Gospel

Our Bible Truth is:

What is the Gospel?

It's Salvation through Faith in Jesus Christ...

God made us and we should obey Him!

God made all people--including you and me! And He made us to know Him, love Him and obey Him. He's our good king. But just like the people of Athens, we need God's forgiveness for disobeying Him. God freely offers it to us when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. He loves to help us do this. Ask Him!

Close in prayer.

Closing ACTS Prayer

- A** God, we praise You for being the good Creator and King of the world.

Bible Truth 2 Concept: Salvation through Faith in Jesus Christ...We Have All Disobeyed God and Deserve His Punishment

God is our good Creator. He made us with a spirit so we can know and love Him. He is our good King. He gave us good laws that show us how to love Him and love each other. Life is most wonderful when we know and love God, and we live as He wants us to live.

But instead of choosing God and His wonderful way of life, we have all chosen to disobey Him and His good laws. We have chosen to live life our own, selfish way, instead. This is what the Bible calls sin. Because God is good, He hates sin...and He will punish it. And oh, how terrible is God's punishment for sin! It is to live apart from Him and everything good forever! Every single one of us deserve this punishment for our sins.

But God isn't only good; He's merciful, too. Merciful means treating us better than we deserve, and that's just exactly how God offers to treat us. Yes, our sins must be punished, but God has chosen to take that punishment on Himself. That's why He sent Jesus, His own dear Son, to earth. Jesus came to take the punishment we deserved for our sins when He suffered and died on the cross. God promises to forgive all who turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior. That can even include you and me! Isn't God amazing? How great is God's love for us!

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Practice telling story with expression. Look for words that might be new to your children. Plan to explain the meaning of them to the children. The numbers in the story correspond to elements of the picture. Practice pointing to the pictures as you read the story. Shorten the story, if necessary, for your child/group of children.
3. If desired, choose a listening assignment for the children (listed below). Listening with a purpose helps the children keep focused and glean more from the story. The three, different assignments allow you to re-tell the story three times with fresh purpose. Answers to the listening assignments are found at the end of the story.

During your presentation:

1. If you are telling the story to a group of children, maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story. Tell the story with enthusiasm and expression. Take time to show each story scene to the children as you tell it. Use the cue numbers in the story to highlight corresponding parts of the picture as you tell the story.
2. The Clue Catcher question at the bottom of each scene helps the children keep engaged with the story.
3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.
5. At end of the story, repeat the listening assignment question and ask for answers. Close in prayer.

Learn a Little: "There is not a righteous man on earth who does good and never sins."

Meaning:

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. He created it all good. Oh, how wonderful was the love that those first people had for God! Oh, how wonderful it was to know Him and to obey Him! The big Bible word for loving God and living His good way is "righteous."

Bible Truth 3 Concept: Salvation through Faith in Jesus Christ...God Sent Jesus to Pay for the Sins of God's People!

What a mess we have made in God's good world! God is our good Maker and King, yet we have all chosen to disobey Him. Because God is good, He hates sin and He is right to punish our sins. We certainly deserve it! The punishment for sins is death--being separated from God and all His goodness forever. How sad!

But God is not only good. He is also very merciful. He treats us better than we deserve. That's why God, Himself, made a way for us to be forgiven our sins and to become His people. God sent His own, dear Son, Jesus to live the perfect life of love and obedience that we should live, but never do. On the cross, Jesus offered His perfect life to God as the full payment for sin for all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior. Jesus suffered and died in our place. Then on the third day, Jesus rose up from the dead, showing that He had really beaten sin and death! Jesus can be our Savior, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Him as our Savior.

Meaning

God is our good King and Creator and we should love and obey Him. But the sad news is that we all choose to disobey Him...and we all deserve His punishment.

Yes, we deserve His punishment, but God has loved us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus to take the punishment that we deserve instead. Jesus lived a perfect life and chose to give it up to pay for our sins. On the cross He suffered and died. He was pierced with nails in His hands and feet. He was pierced in His side with a sword. He took all of the punishment that we deserve from God for our sins so that we could be forgiven. Jesus made the way for us to have peace with God by suffering in our place.

Who did Jesus do this for? It is God's free gift to all who put their trust in Jesus as their Savior and choose to live for Him. This gift can be for you, too! Ask God to help you. He loves to answer this prayer!

The Case of the Savior, from Start to Finish*Genesis, The Gospels***Story-telling Tips**

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Practice telling story with expression. Look for words that might be new to your children. Plan to explain the meaning of them to the children. The numbers in the story correspond to elements of the picture. Practice pointing to the pictures as you read the story. Shorten the story, if necessary, for your child/group of children.
3. If desired, choose a listening assignment for the children (listed below). Listening with a purpose helps the children keep focused and glean more from the story. The three, different assignments allow you to re-tell the story three times with fresh purpose. Answers to the listening assignments are found at the end of the story.

During your presentation:

1. If you are telling the story to a group of children, maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story. Tell the story with enthusiasm and expression. Take time to show each story scene to the children as you tell it. Use the cue numbers in the story to highlight corresponding parts of the picture as you tell the story.
2. The Clue Catcher question at the bottom of each scene helps the children keep engaged with the story.
3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.
5. At end of the story, repeat the listening assignment question and ask for answers. Close in prayer.

And it was all good. VERY good.

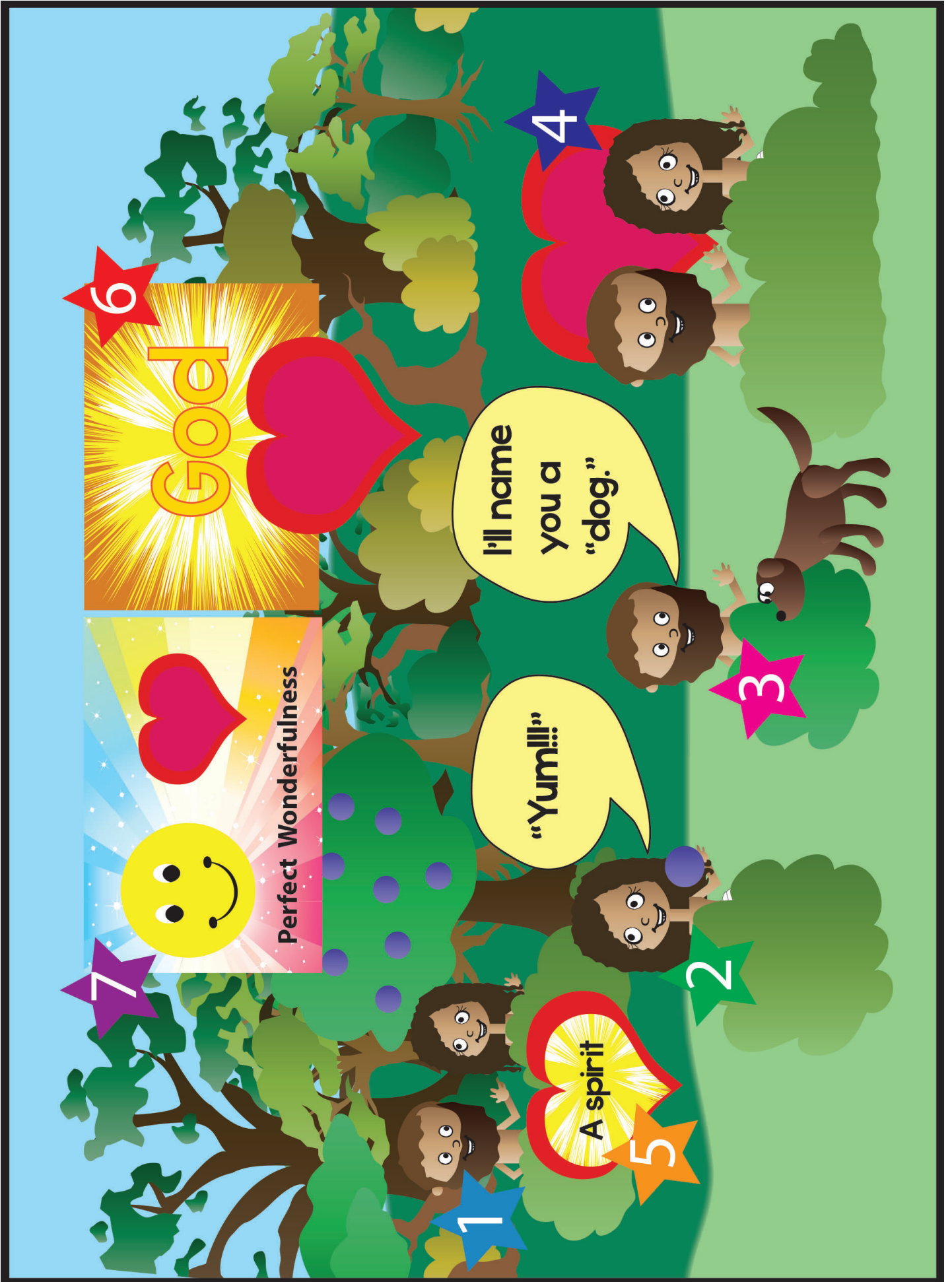

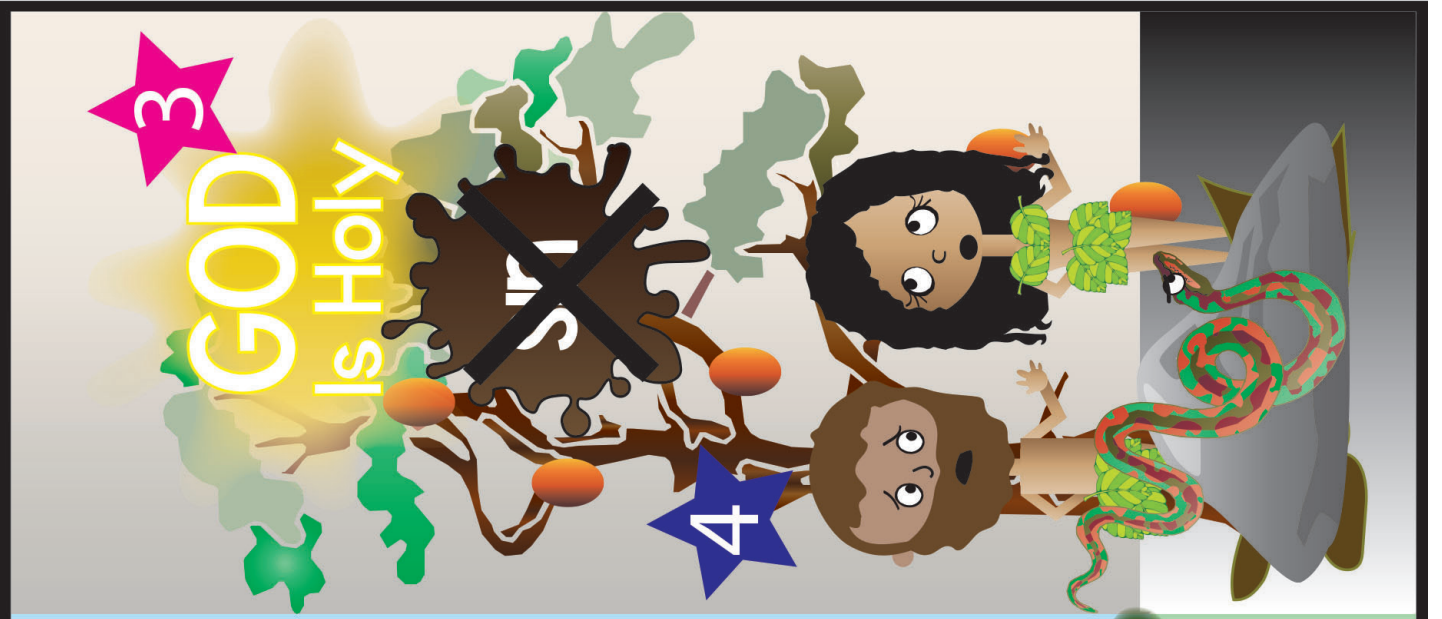
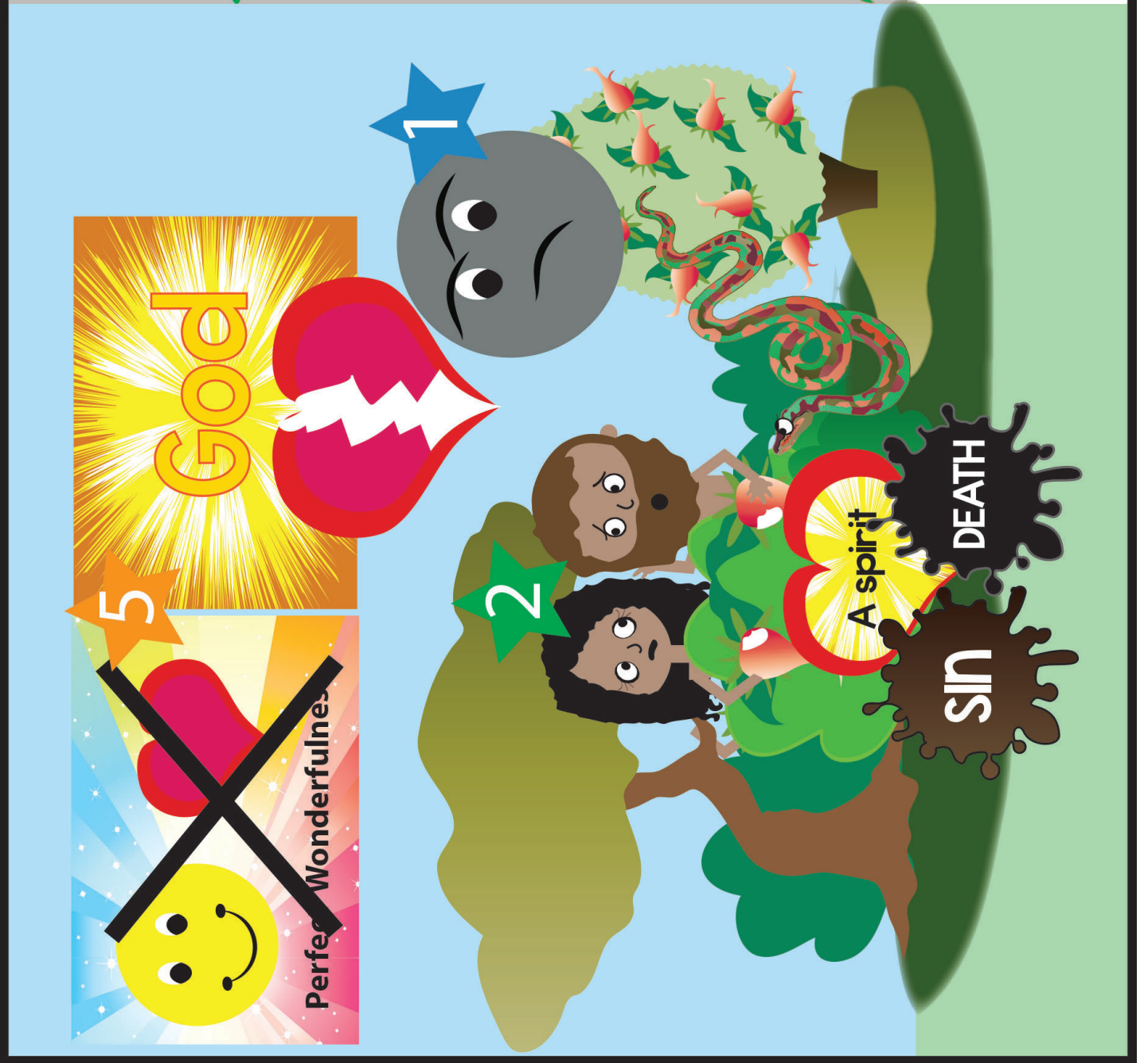

Oh, what a lot Adam and Eve lost on that sad, sad day!

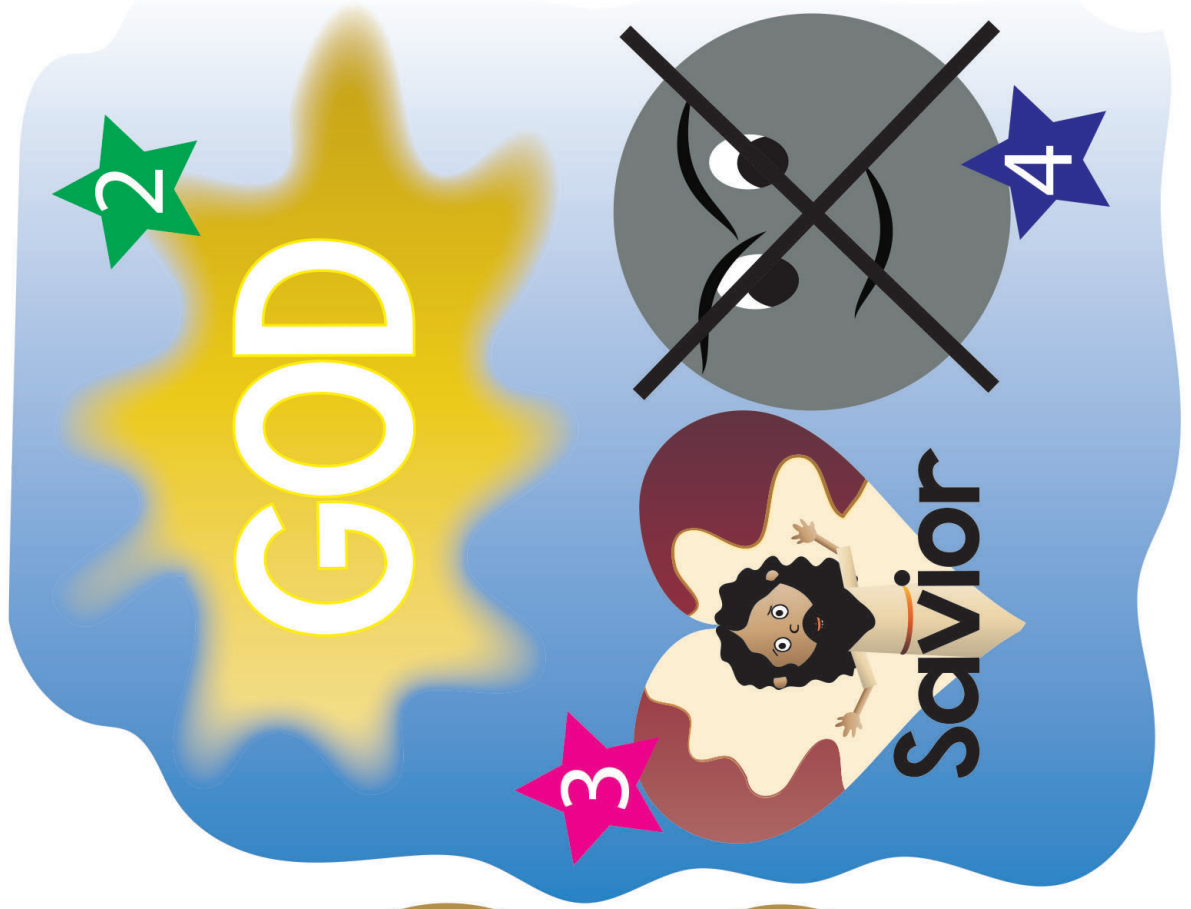
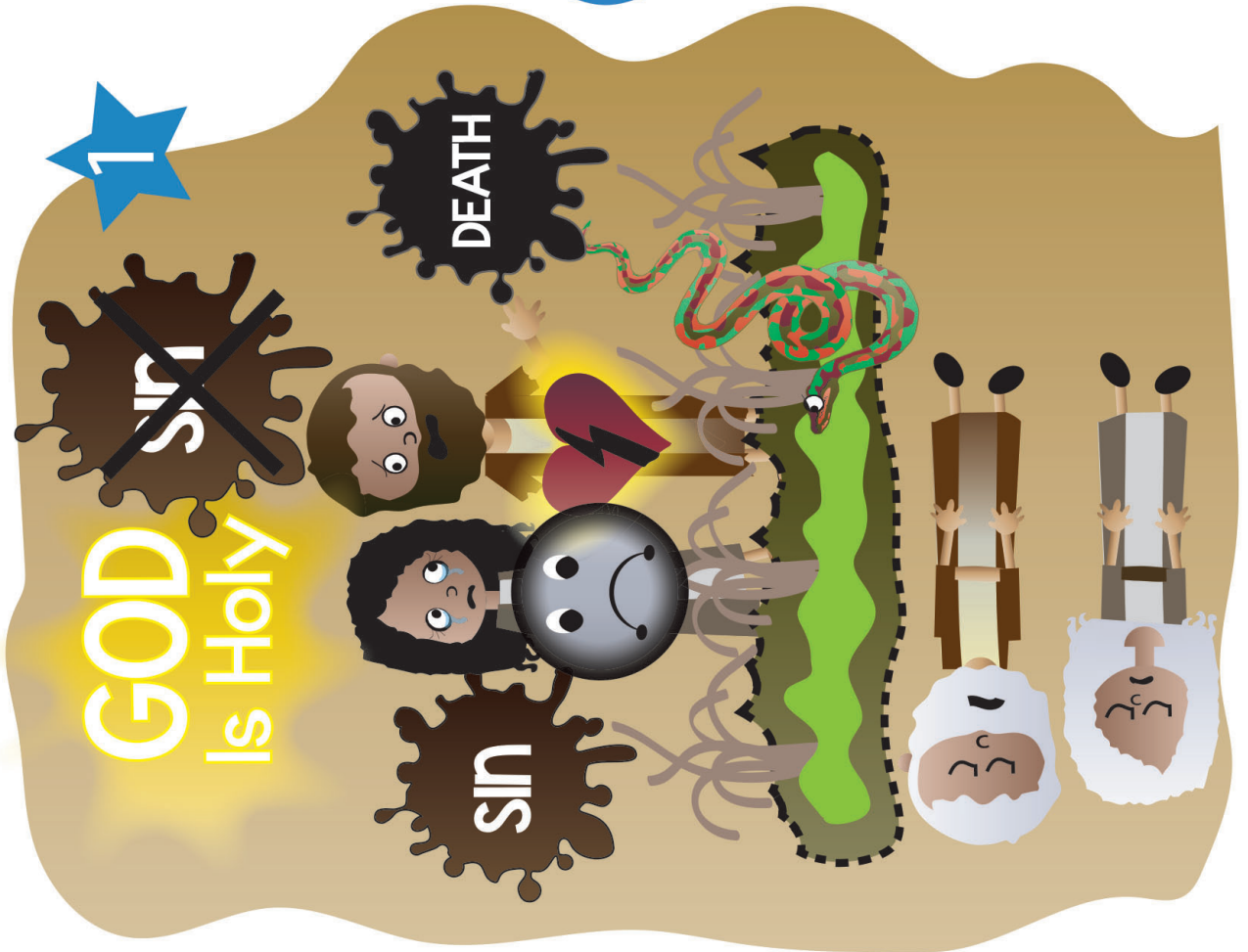

Learn a Little: "The punishment that brought us peace was upon him."

Meaning

God is our good King and Creator and we should love and obey Him. But the sad news is that we all choose to disobey Him...and we all deserve His punishment.

Bible Truth 3 Meaning

What a mess we have made in God's good world! God is our good Maker and King, yet we have all chosen to disobey Him. Because God is good, He hates sin and He is right to punish our sins. 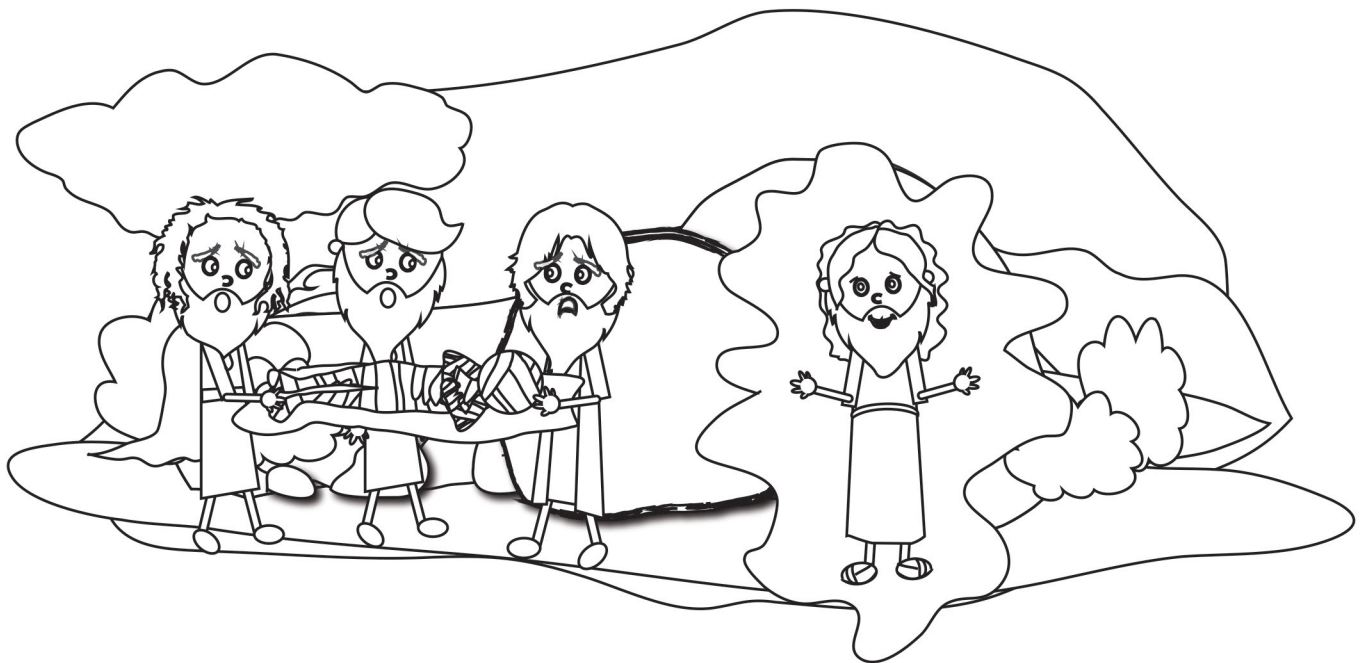
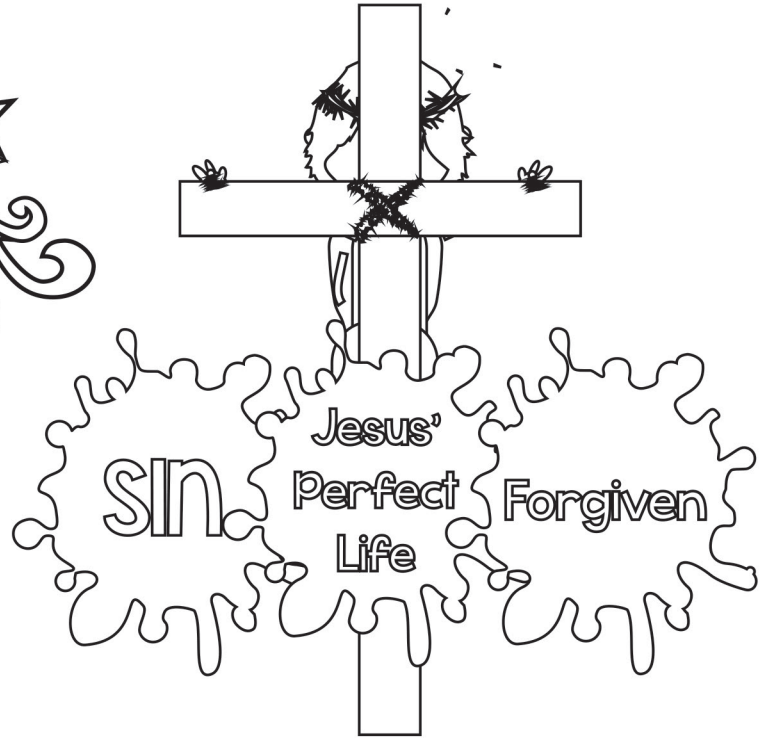

Bible Truth 4 Concept: Salvation through Faith in Jesus Christ...God Saves All Who Repent of Their Sins and Trust in Jesus as Their Savior!

God is our good Creator and King. He made us to know Him, love Him and obey His good laws. But sadly, we all have chosen to disobey God and His good laws. We deserve His punishment for our sins. We have all turned away from Him.

The Case of the Changes in Cruddy Crete*Titus***Story-telling Tips**

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Practice telling story with expression. Look for words that might be new to your children. Plan to explain the meaning of them to the children. The numbers in the story correspond to elements of the picture. Practice pointing to the pictures as you read the story. Shorten the story, if necessary, for your child/group of children.
3. If desired, choose a listening assignment for the children (listed below). Listening with a purpose helps the children keep focused and glean more from the story. The three, different assignments allow you to re-tell the story three times with fresh purpose. Answers to the listening assignments are found at the end of the story.

During your presentation:

1. If you are telling the story to a group of children, maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story. Tell the story with enthusiasm and expression. Take time to show each story scene to the children as you tell it. Use the cue numbers in the story to highlight corresponding parts of the picture as you tell the story.
2. The Clue Catcher question at the bottom of each scene helps the children keep engaged with the story.
3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.
5. At end of the story, repeat the listening assignment question and ask for answers. Close in prayer.

What do you think they wanted to tell them?

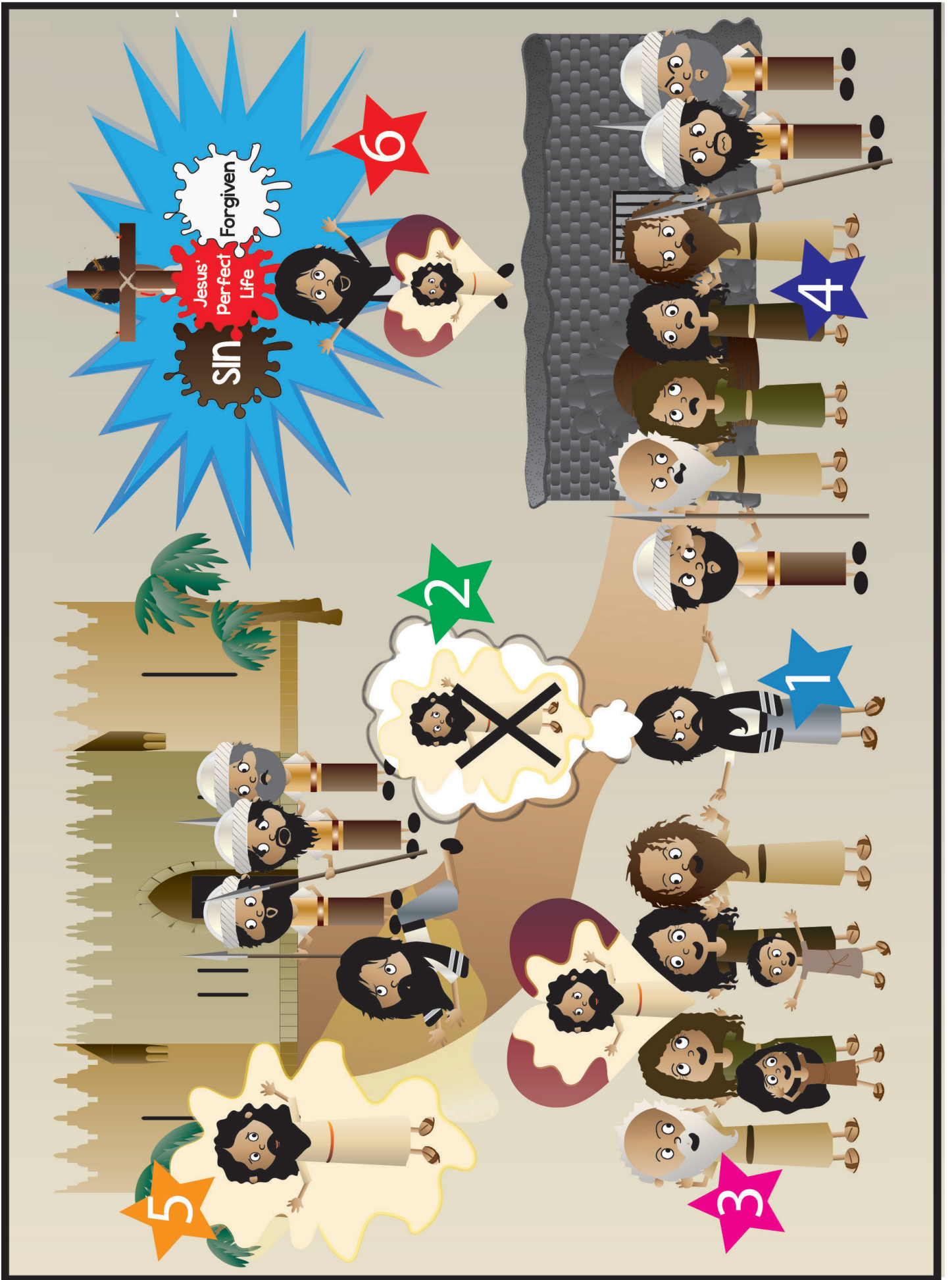
Paul and Titus wanted to tell the people of Cruddy Crete  the gospel—the good news that Jesus, the Savior had come and could save them--even them--from their sins.

What happened on Cruddy Crete after Titus read Paul's letter and shared it with the believers? Did the new believers keep on repenting of their sins as well as believing in Jesus? The Bible doesn't tell us. It would have been hard to do on Cruddy Crete, but not impossible.

Why? Because God doesn't just help people repent and believe in Jesus at the beginning. He promises to keep helping them to believe in Him and live for Him their whole lives—even in a place like Cruddy Crete, where wicked ways were right at home.

Bible Truth 4 Meaning

God gave every person a heart to know and love Him. He made all sorts of wonderful things in the world around them to see what He is like. But when people saw Jesus and all He did and said, they were seeing what God is like more than ever before. Why? Because Jesus IS God! When we hear the stories of Jesus in the Bible, we can know more of what God is like, too!

How do I know this is true? The Bible tells me so!

8. Who stay to help the new believers in Crete? *Titus did.*

9. How did Paul encourage the new believers when he heard they were struggling? He wrote them a letter and urged them to keep on believing in God and keep on repenting. He told them God would help them.

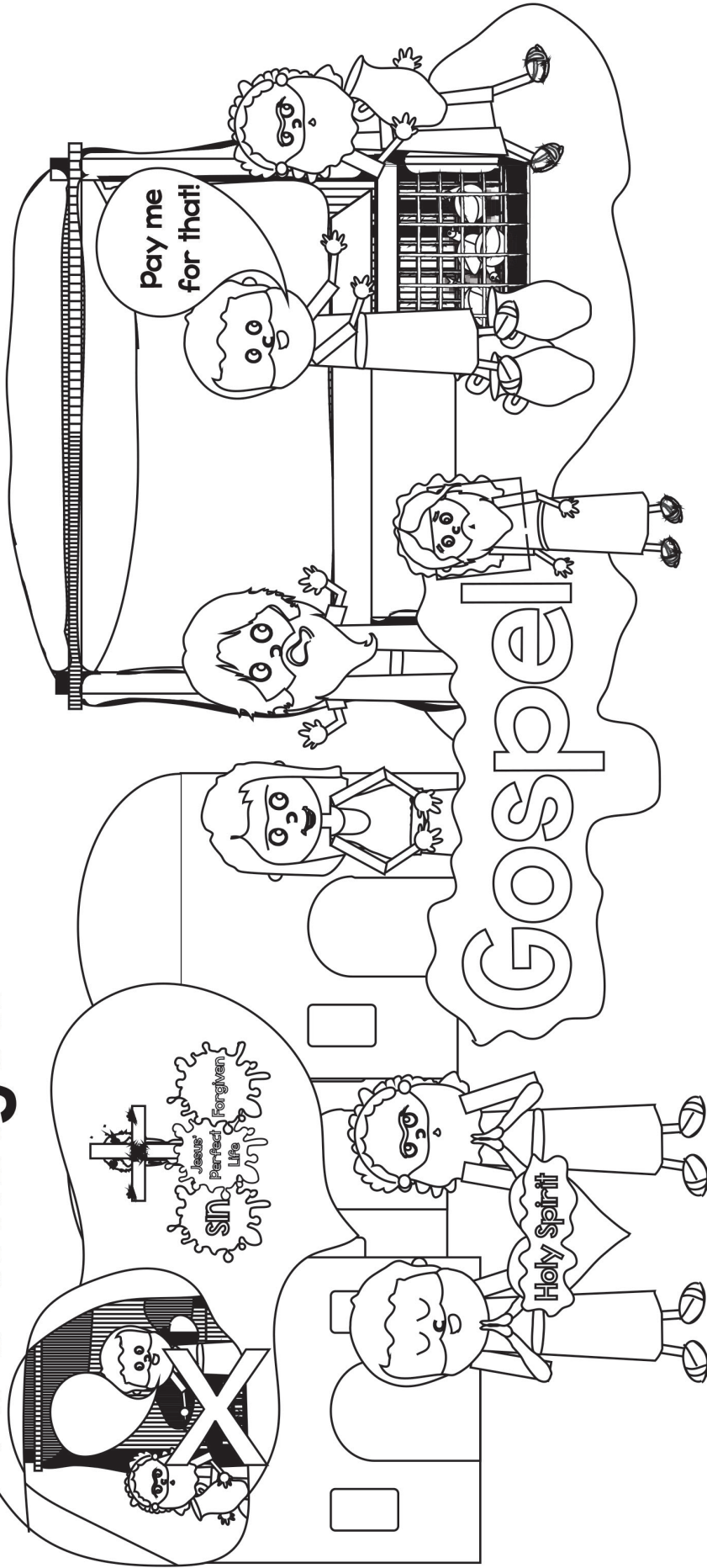
