



Bountiful
Start with flat right hand on top of left S hand. Move right hand over and down thumb side of left S hand.

Tongue
Point both "L" hands towards each other, then move each hand to the side twisting them from the wrist as they move outward.


Breathes
Both open flat hands are placed on chest and moved forward and back off of chest a few times. (Simulating rise and fall of chest in breathing.)



Light, Shines
"Hold both hands at chest level, fingertips together. Open hands into "5" hands as they move up and out to the side, palms facing out.

Hills
Both "5" hands, palms facing forward and fingertips up, trace a way line like a line of mountain (or hill) tops.

Descends
Right hand, index finger extended, moves downward a few inches.



Plains
Thumb and fingers of both hands, palms facing up, are moved back and forth over each other, as if feeling imaginary soil in each hand.

Distills
Hold both "And" hands together in front of body, then open hands, spreading fingers apart, as both hands move forward and to each side.

Rain
Move both hands down as you wiggle the fingers.

Thumb of right "L" hand, palm facing left, touches left shoulder, then is brought down to touch right hip.



Majestic
Both upturned open hands held in front of body and lifted up in front of the face.




Name
Right open hand, palm facing left, is held up



Earth
Thumb and index fingers of downturned right "5" hand are placed on sides of downturned "5" hand. The right hand pivots back and forth while keeping light contact with left hand.




Heavens
Right flat hand is held slightly above head level with fingers pointing left and palm facing down. Hand sweeps in front of or over head in an arc from left to right.



Work
Move open hands, palms down side to side at the same time.



Moon
Cross K hands, with right hand above the left, pinky fingers down, both hands pointing slightly outward. In this position, make a small counterclockwise.



Man
"P" hands, held side by side, make alternating forward circles.



Mindful, Care
Both "K" hands, fingers pointing outward, move up and down a few times.



Heavens, Sky
Right flat hand is held slightly above head level with fingers pointing left and palm facing down. Hand sweeps in front of or over head in an arc from left to right.



Proclaims, Declares
Touch lips with index fingers then pivot them forward and to the sides.



God
Right open hand, palm facing left, is held up above head level then brought down and back in a slight arc, ending with a "B" hand at the upper chest level.



Handiwork
Move open hands, palms down side to side at the same time.



Day
Left arm, palm down, faces right with index finger extended and touching elbow of right arm, which points up with index finger extended up. Right arm is then pivoted down in an arc until it rests just above left elbow.



Speech
Right index finger touches mouth then makes a small forward circle as it moves to point outward.



Night
Left flat hand is held horizontally, palms facing down, fingers pointing right. Curved right hand, palm down and fingers pointing forward is brought down to rest on back of left hand, ending with fingers pointing downward.



Knowledge
Pat forehead with right fingers several times.



Voice
The index and middle fingers of the right "V" hand are placed on throat, then brought forward under chin and out.

Heard
Cupped right hand is placed behind right ear.







Words
Tips of right index finger and thumb are held about an inch apart as they are brought to touch index finger of extended left index finger.



Ends
Index of right hand is held near chest and points outward, then is moved outward from chest.



Earth
Thumb and index fingers of downturned right "5" hand are placed on sides of downturned "S" hand. The right hand pivots back and forth while keeping light contact with left hand.
