Big Question and Answer: "How Can We Be Saved? It Is God's Free Gift!"

Bible Truth 1 Concept: God Saves Sinners Who Confess Their Sins

God is perfectly holy. There is no sin in Him at all. He is too holy for sin to even live in His presence. How gloriously magnificent and pure is He!

But we are all sinners. We have all chosen to rebel against God and His good ways. Not only can we not live in His presence because of our sinfulness, but we deserve to be shut out of His presence forever because of it. And there's nothing sinful people like us can do on our own to make ourselves acceptable to God.

We would be without hope, except for God's amazing grace and mercy! He, Himself, has done what was needed. He sent His Son Jesus to live a perfect life and offer it up as the perfect payment for the sins of His people when He suffered and died on the cross. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead, showing He had beat sin and death. Yes, He had fully paid for the sins of God's people. He has made salvation a gift.

How can we receive this wonderful gift? God offers forgiveness of sins and eternal life to all who confess their sins to Him and trust in Jesus as their Savior. When we do this, turning away from living life our own way and living for God instead, He will give us this gift! He will make us His people forever!

Big Question Under Investigation: Big Question 11 and Songs	<p>"Now it's time to turn today's Big Question Under Investigation.</p> <p>It's: How Can We Be Saved?</p> <p>We are all sinners who choose to disobey God. No matter how hard we try, we can never please God or earn eternal life on our own. We would have to live God's way perfectly to do that. That's why we need a Savior to save us from our sins, if we are to know God and become His people. Jesus, God's Son, is the Savior we need! He died on the cross to pay for the sins of God's people. He rose from the dead in victory! He alone can give us the gifts of knowing God and enjoying eternal life with Him. 2. DIGGING DEEP DOWN: Key Concept and Story (*introduce the Bible Truth and tell the related story*)**Bible Truth 1**

"It's time for us to dig down deeper for answers to our Big Question. We're learning **FOUR** Bible Truths that all tell us something about the salvation God offers us. We are learning the first one today.

The Bible Truth we are going to be thinking about today is:
God Saves Sinners Who Confess Their Sins.

God is perfectly holy. There is no sin in Him at all. He is too holy for sin to even live in His presence. How gloriously magnificent and pure is He!

But we are all sinners. We have all chosen to rebel against God and His good ways. God’s people love to think about what God has done to save them. He loved them so much that He chose to send Jesus, His One and Only Son to suffer and die for their sins on the cross. They are saved because He died in their place! Their hearts are smitten with--that is, overwhelmed-- the greatness of His love for them, such undeserving sinners.

**New Testament
Story:**

**The Case of the
Ridiculous Runner**
Luke 15

"Now it's time for today's story called: **The Case of the Ridiculous Runner.**

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Who was the Ridiculous Runner? Who thought his running was ridiculous? (Ridiculous means something silly that you wouldn't expect them to do).**
- 2. Why did he run even though it was thought ridiculous? Who did he run to? What does the Ridiculous Runner tells us about God?**

(If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

1. Who was the Ridiculous Runner? Who thought his running was ridiculous? (Ridiculous means something silly that you wouldn't expect them to do). The father of the two young men in Jesus' story. Everyone in Jesus' time would think it ridiculous for an honored old man to run. The teachers of the law especially would have looked down on this man for running.

2. Why did he run even though it was thought ridiculous? Who did he run to? What does the Ridiculous Runner tells us about God? He ran because his son was returning home to him when he thought he would never see him again. He was so happy to see him! He ran to his son. That God rejoices over sinners who come to Him, confessing their sins. He loves them and welcomes them into His family.

Close in prayer. (prayer suggestions included at end of story)

LESSON 2 STORY

Story of the Saints:

**The Case of the

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Why were the mountains called the Mountains of Death?**
- 2. Who went to those mountains to bring life? How did they do that?**

(If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

1. Why were the mountains called the Mountains of Death?

Because of all the terrible sicknesses there were there. Many people died.

2. Who went to those mountains to bring life? How did they do that? The Brands went to these mountains to bring medicine, but most importantly, to bring the good news of Jesus. As people heard the gospel, many confessed their sins and trusted in Jesus as their Savior. This brought God's life to the Mountains of Death.

Close in prayer. (prayer suggestions included at end of story)

Story:****The Case of the

Sinner***2 Samuel 11-12*

"Now it's time for today's story called: **The Case of the Not-So-Secret Sinner.**

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Who was the Not-So-Secret Sinner? How did he try to cover up his sin?**
- 2. Who knew about his sin and prompted him to confess it? How did God respond to this secret sinner's confession to Him?**

(If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

- 1. Who was the Not-So-Secret Sinner? How did he try to cover up his sin?**

David. He had Bathsheba's husband killed in battle to get rid of him.

- 2. Who knew about his sin and prompted him to confess it? How did God respond to this secret sinner's confession to Him?** The LORD knew. He used Nathan the prophet to help David see his sins and turn away from them. The LORD forgave David when he confessed his sins.

Close in prayer. (prayer suggestions included at end of story)

3. TAKING ACTION: Response Activities *(choose from among these activities)***Response
Activities**

- **ACTS Prayer Activity:** Add your own prayer requests to the ACTS prayer
- **Sneaky Snack:** Story-related snack
- **Bible Truth Review Activity:** Game with questions related to the Bible Truth
- **Bible Truth Hymn:** Music activities to learn a portion of a Bible Truth-related hymn
- **Bible Verse Review Activity:** Game with questions related to Bible Truth Bible verse
- **Bible Verse Song:** Music activities to learn the Bible Verse song
- **Story Review Activity:** Game with questions related to the Bible Truth and Case
- **Case RePlay, Jr. and Sr.:** Two drama activities that review the story: one for younger children, one for older children.
- **Craft:** Story-related craft
- **VIPP (Very Important Prayer Person):** Game and a coloring activity to help children learn about people in your church and how to pray for them.
