**Sinner**  
Both "X" hands, held near sides with palms facing up, move upward and outward in circles simultaneously.




**Poor**  
Right curved hand is placed under left elbow. Pull the fingers down into an "and" hand a few times.




**Wounded, Sore**  
Index fingers are thrust towards each other several times until almost touching.



**Jesus**  
Middle, bent finger of right "5" hand touches middle of left open palm, palms facing each other. Then middle, bent finger of left "5" hand touches middle of right open palm, palms facing each other.



**Save, Savior**  
"S" hands are crossed in front of body, palms facing in. Move both hands out to the side while pivoting the palms to face outward.



**Love**  
Fists are crossed on chest, palms facing body.



**Embrace**  
Hands clasp opposite arms in natural hug position.



**Arms**  
Right index finger moves down length of left forearm.



**Charms**  
Both flat hands are moved in a forward circular motion with palms brushing chest on the inward portion of the circle.

**Wages**  
Pinky side of curved right hand, palm facing in, slides along palm of flat left hand. End with the right hand closed.



**Sin**  
Both "X" hands, held near sides with palms facing up, move upward and outward in circles simultaneously.




**Death**  
Hold both flat hands in front of body with fingertips pointing forward, right flat hand palm up and left flat hand palm down. Flip both over towards the left until the right palm is face down and the left palm is face up.



**Gift**  
Both modified "Z" hands are held at chest, then brought down and forward, as if giving something to someone.



**God**  
Right open hand, palm facing left, is held up above head level then brought down and back in a slight arc, ending with a "B" hand at the upper chest level.



**Eternal**  
Downturned right "Y" hand moves up and away from body.



**Life**  
Upturned thumbs of "A" hands move upward in front of chest in unison.



**Christ Jesus**  
Middle, bent finger of right "5" hand touches middle of left open palm, palms facing each other. Then middle, bent finger of left "5" hand touches middle of right open palm, palms facing each other.



**Lord**  
Thumb of right "L" hand, palm facing left, touches left shoulder, then is brought down to touch right hip.
