Come
Place fingertips of right and hand at near chin moving toward the cheek with a slightly curved hand.



Heavy-laden
Place fingertips of both hands on right shoulder, bearing down.

Ruined
Hold both closed hands in front of body with each thumb tip in crook of index fingers, left hand in front of right hand.. Knuckles of right hand brush along index finger side of left hand then continue out a bit further beyond it.



The Fall
Right "5" hand is held off to the right side at head height, palm facing the body. Pivot hand around sharply until palm faces forward.




Tarry
Both curved open hands are held palms facing up in front of body, right hand behind left hand. Wiggle all fingers..



Jesus
Middle, bent finger of right "5" hand touches middle of left open palm, palms facing each other. Then middle, bent finger of left "5" hand touches middle of right open palm, palms facing each other.



Arms
Right index finger moves down length of left forearm.



Savior
"S" hands are crossed in front of body, palms facing in. Move both hands out to the side while pivoting the palms to face outward.



Charms
Both flat hands are moved in a forward circular motion with palms brushing chest on the inward portion of the circle.



Trespass
Both "X" hands, held near sides with palms facing up, move upward and outward in circles simultaneously.




Man
Thumb of right open hand touches forehead, then the chest.



Death
Hold both flat hands in front of body with fingertips pointing forward, right flat hand palm up and left flat hand palm down. Flip both over towards the left until the right palm is face down and the left palm is face up.



Reign, Reigned
Move hands back and forth as if pulling forwards and back on horse's reins.



More
Bring fingers of both "and" hands together.



Grace
Begin with fingertips of right hand touching, palm facing forward. Twist wrist around, bringing hand down and palm facing body, while at the same time opening up the fingers and flattening the hand.



Righteousness
Right "H" hand, palm facing left, slides from heel to fingertips of left flat hand, palm up, changing into a flat hand as it moves down left palm.



Life
Upturned thumbs of "A" hands move upward in front of chest in unison.



Christ Jesus
Middle, bent finger of right "5" hand touches middle of left open palm, palms facing each other. Then middle, bent finger of left "5" hand touches middle of right open palm, palms facing each other.



Lord
Thumb of right "L" hand, palm facing left, touches left shoulder, then is brought down to touch right hip.



Looks, See
Index and middle finger of right "V" hand, palm facing in, are placed near eyes then moved forward.



Sons of Men
"P" hands, held side by side, make alternating forward circles.




Understand/Wise
Right "S" hand is placed on forehead, palm facing in. Right index finger extends up, making a "D" hand.




God
Right open hand, palm facing left, is held up above head level then brought down and back in a slight arc, ending with a "B" hand at the upper chest level.



Turned Away/Aside
Index fingers are held close together, pointing upward. Right index finger is then moved away to the right as if straying away.



Corrupt
Right hand, palm facing down, is placed under chin, fingers pointing left. Wiggle fingers a few times.



Good
Fingers of right flat hand are placed at lips, then brought forward. Some end this sign by resting the right hand in the upturned palm of the left flat hand.



One (Number)
Hold up right index, palm facing forward.



Sheep are animals who need a shepherd to lead them and keep them safe. Without a shepherd, they easily wander away on their own, getting lost, getting hurt or even getting eaten by another animal! God tells us in the Bible that people are like sheep. We have all wandered away from Him, our good shepherd. Left to ourselves, we will all eventually face the consequences of our turning away from Him: death!

But Jesus is the good shepherd of His people! He is God's Son, sent to rescue all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior. Upon Him, the LORD laid all of our iniquity (our sins). That is, He paid for them when He suffered and died on the cross. He rose from the dead on the third day showing that He had really done it. So, instead of getting the punishment of death that they justly deserve for turning away from God, all who trust in Jesus are forgiven and receive eternal life with God.

Back of right "V" hand is placed on back of left forearm. Open and close right "V" fingers as they move up left forearm.


Astray, Turned Aside
Index fingers are held close together, pointing upward. Right index finger is then moved away to the right as if straying away.



Every
Left "A" hand is held in front of the body, palm facing right. Thumb and knuckles of right "A" hand are slide down thumb of left hand several times.

Way
Flat hands, palms facing each other, move forward and progressively closer.

Lord
Thumb of right "L" hand, palm facing left. touches left shoulder, then is brought down to touch right hip.




Laid
"O" hands are moved downward simultaneously.

Him
Point right index finger forward.

Hold up right index, palm facing forward






