Bible Truth 2 Concept: God Loved His People Before They Loved Him

Even before God created the world, He loved His people. Even back then, He knew all about them. He knew that they would be sinners like everyone else. He knew they would all rebel against Him and deserve His punishment for their sins.

Yet even though He knew all this about them before even a single one of them was born, He loved them deeply and wanted them to be His people. He chose to set His love upon them in a special way. He chose to send His Son, Jesus, to pay for their sins. He chose that by the Holy Spirit, He would give them faith in Jesus, and through that faith, He would forgive their sins. He would give them each a new heart to love and obey Him. They would be His special people--a countless number from every language and people on earth, who would live to enjoy Him and praise His amazing love forever.

We can know God's love and be His dearly loved people, too, when we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

That's because it's based on Jesus' perfect life and love, not on sinful life and unsteady love. God's people rejoice in how good God is to them! They give thanks to Him for His always faithful love. It will never, ever end. It truly is more than they could ever deserve.

2. DIGGING DEEP DOWN: Key Concept and Story (*introduce the Bible Truth and tell the related story*)**Bible Truth 2**

"It's time for us to dig down deeper for answers to our Big Question. We're learning **SIX** Bible Truths that all tell us something about God's love for His people. We have learned one already. Can you remember what it is? (God Blesses All People with Many Good Gifts.)

The Bible Truth we are going to be thinking about today is:

God Loved His People Before They Loved Him.

Even before God created the world, He loved His people. Even back then, He knew all about them. He knew that they would be sinners like everyone else. He knew they would all rebel against Him and deserve His punishment for their sins.

Yet even though He knew all this about them before even a single one of them was born, He loved them deeply and wanted them to be His people. He chose to set His love upon them in a special way. He chose to send His Son, Jesus, to pay for their sins. He chose that by the Holy Spirit, He would give them faith in Jesus, and through that faith, He would forgive their sins. They know that their sinful hearts would never choose God if He had loved them and chose them first. They know without God choosing to send Jesus to save them from their sins, they would never ever know God. This makes the name of Jesus the sweetest name on earth.

Ephesians 1:4-6

God loved His people long before they loved Him. He loved them and chose to adopt them as His sons (and daughter), even before He created the world. Why did He do this? Because it pleased Him to do it! It would show how wonderful He is and how great the good gifts He gives His people because of Jesus. We think of what He's done and we praise Him for being so good to people like us. People who are sinners, but through Jesus, are made to be holy--without sin and without blame in His sight.

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. Whose love was so long-lived? Who did he love?

2. When did his love for them begin? What was so lavish about it? *(If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)*

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

1. Whose love was so long-lived? Who did he love? The LORD. He loved all of His people.

2. When did his love for them begin? What was so lavish about it? It began before the creation of the world. He loved them, even though they were sinners who would rebel against Him. He loved them by giving His beloved Son to suffer and die for their sins.

Close in prayer. (prayer suggestions included at end of story)

LESSON 2 STORY**Story of the Saints:****The Case of the Doctor Who Needed Patience**

"Now it's time for today's story called: **The Case of the Doctor Who Needed Patience.**

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. Who was the doctor who needed patience? Who needed to be patient with him? How?

2. What did the Lord do to bring the change that was so patiently waited for?

(If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

1. Who was the doctor who needed patience? Who needed to be patient with him? How? Dr. William Mackay. His mother. She needed to patiently wait for the Lord to answer her prayers and hopes that her son would be saved.

2. What did the Lord do to bring the change that was so patiently waited for? He used the very Bible that she had him take with him to school.

2. DIGGING DEEP DOWN, continued**LESSON 3****New Testament Story:****The Case of the Chosen Who Needed Courage**
Acts 12:20-35

"Now it's time for today's story called: **The Case of the Chosen Who Needed Courage.**

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Who were the chosen? Who had chosen them and when?**
- 2. What did He chose them to be and to do? How did this give them courage?**

(If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

1. Who were the chosen? Who had chosen them, to be what? When did He chose them? The believers in Jesus (in general), but the believers in Ephesus (in this story). The Lord chose them to be His dear, adopted people, saved through Jesus. He did this before He even created the world.

2. Why did they need courage? What did they take courage from? Others in Ephesus were persecuting them for being Christians. From knowing that God had chosen them and made them His dear, adopted people. He would take care of them in this life and one day, take them to be with Him forever in heaven.

Close in prayer. (prayer suggestions included at end of story)

3. TAKING ACTION: Response Activities *(choose from among these activities)***Response Activities**

- **ACTS Prayer Activity:** Add your own prayer requests to the ACTS prayer
- **Sneaky Snack:** Story-related snack
- **Bible Truth Review Activity:** Game with questions related to the Bible Truth
- **Bible Truth Hymn:** Music activities to learn a portion of a Bible Truth-related hymn
- **Bible Verse Review Activity:** Game with questions related to Bible Truth Bible verse
- **Bible Verse Song:** Music activities to learn the Bible Verse song
- **Story Review Activity:** Game with questions related to the Bible Truth and Case
- **Case RePlay, Jr. and Sr.:** Two drama activities that review the story: one for younger children, one for older children.
- **Craft:** Story-related craft
- **VIPP (Very Important Prayer Person):** Game and a coloring activity to help children learn about people in your church and how to pray for them.

4. TAKING IT TO OTHERS *Optional presentations for the last few minutes of class***Presenting to Other Children**

If you split the children into different response activities, you can gather the children together again and have each small group make presentations to show the other children what they learned. Presentation ideas are included in the resources for each activity.

If you keep your children together for response activities, you can have them make a presentation of something they have learned to their parents when they come to pick them up from class. Presentation ideas are included in the resources for each activity.
