The Case of the Peace-Maker

Our story is called:**The Case of the Peace-Maker.****As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:**

1. Who was at war? How did they make peace?
2. How did Don use the tribes' peace maker to tell the people about Jesus?

This story doesn't take place in Bible times. It takes place in the 1960's in Irian Jaya, the home of the Sawi peoples.

The Sawis lived very simple lives. They wore almost no clothes. Their tools and weapons were made from sticks, stones and bones. They lived in huts of cane pole and straw built on stilts high up off the swampy jungle ground. They ate beetle grubs, sago palm tree bread, and wild pig...and sometimes they even ate their enemies! Yes, the terrible truth was that the Sawis were cannibals—people who eat people!

There were many Sawi tribes in Irian Jaya, but this story is about the Sawi of Haenam village. These Sawi were fierce warriors. Many proudly wore grass skirts—the symbol that they had killed a man in battle. They wore long necklaces of teeth from the crocodiles, wild pigs and dogs they killed. They took delight in tricking their enemies with lies. In Haenam village, no one was honored more than Mahaen, Kani, Maum, Giriman, Nair, and Warahai. These warriors were feared by the other Sawi for their many terrible, deadly tricks.

The other Sawis had another reason to honor Haenam village. They had Tuans living among them! What are Tuans? Tuans were large beings like them, but with dazzling, white skin, the Sawis said. Their hair wasn't dark and curly hair like the Sawis. It was straight or wavy, and many different colors. They covered their bodies in colorful skins. No one had ever seen a female Tuan, so maybe there were only males, some said.

Tuans seemed to be friendly. They didn't want to hurt others, but they carried powerful weapons that could kill and made a very loud noise. They had strong, shiny tools, too, that could easily cut through the trunk of a sago palm tree. They even had magical powders that when rubbed on skin could make it come clean; and others, when eaten, could heal sores and sicknesses. What were Tuans? Monsters? No, they were white-

skinned people from the United States, who had come to Irian Jaya with guns, modern tools and medicines.

One day, a Tuan man named Don came by dugout canoe to Haenam. At first everyone hid in their huts in fear; but then using the few words of Sawi he knew, he greeted the people and told them he had come to live with them as friends. He was bringing his wife and little boy to live there, too. He promised he would give them some of his wonderful shiny tools if they would help him build a house for his family. His wife would come and bring powders to heal their sicknesses. First the warriors, then the women and children came out of their huts. Fear quickly turned to excitement as they eyed the Tuan's shiny tools.

The warriors and Don built the house quickly, then Don went to get Carol and Stephen, his wife and son. "So there were Tuan females after all...and little boys, too!" the Sawis thought. "And this Tuan female had the special powders to heal sicknesses!" The people whooped and danced around them in excitement. They had Tuans and none of the other villages did!

Tuan Don and Carol were glad to heal the sick Sawi people and give them iron tools to make their lives easier, but they had come to tell them about Jesus. Day after day they learned more of the Sawi language so they could tell them this best of news.

Tuan Don knew enough Sawi to tell them. Early one morning, he climbed up the notched pole and entered the man-house (the long cane pole house where all the men held meetings). All the warriors of Haenam waited for him: even great Mahaen, Kani, Maum, Giriman, Nair, and Warahai. And there, in that room filled with weapons, grass mats, smoldering, smoky fires and cobwebs, Tuan Don began: "I have a true story about

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Create story cue cards on index cards (or highlight text).
3. Practice telling story dramatically, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary to fit your allotted time.
4. Decorate area with story props that help bring your story alive.

During your presentation:

1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story. Point to/use props at important points in the story. Include the kids in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
2. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

the Myao Kodon “the greatest Spirit. Myao Kodon is the great God who is everywhere, all the time,” Tuan Don told them. “He knows everything there is to know. He even knows everything you are thinking inside your head. He keeps everything going: the sun, the moon, the wind, the growing plants...even you. There would be no life without Him.”

The warriors were amazed at Tuan Don’s story. They had never heard anything like this!

Tuan Don went on: “Myao Kodon is all loving and good. He created people to obey Him and delight in His love, but they rebelled against Him. They chose to do things their own way. Hate has filled their hearts. As Myao Kodon’s enemies they deserved to die. He could have put them to death right then, but He did not. He chose to send His Son Jesus to deliver them instead.”

“Jesus came to earth,” Don told them. “He taught people about Myao Kodon and the work He gave Him to do to save people. He never did anything wrong. He would be the perfect payment for His people’s sins.”

“When the time came for Jesus to die, God allowed Judas, one of Jesus’ closest friends to play a big trick on Jesus so that wicked men could catch him and kill Him,” Don told them. “These men had Jesus nailed to a tree to suffer and die. And while He suffered and died, Jesus took the punishment for all the sins of all who would ever turn and trust in Him. He was buried in a tomb, but on the third day, Myao Kodon raised Jesus back to life! Now He would live and reign forever in heaven with Myao Kodon. He had won His victory!”

“This is the message Myao Kodon has sent us to tell you,” Don exclaimed. “You are living as enemies with God. You deserve His punishment, but if you confess your sins to God and trust in Jesus, He will forgive you and you can know and enjoy Him forever. Come! Turn away from your sins! Trust in Jesus, Myao Kodon’s Son!”

The warriors laughed and clapped when Don finished. “Good story! Judas played a great tuwi asonai--treacherous trick!--on Jesus! We like him!

Tuan Don was so disappointed! How would the Sawi ever hear the good news of Jesus? Only God knew! So Tuan Don and Carol prayed: “Lord, please show us how to tell these people the good news of Jesus.”

God answered Tuan Don and Carol’s prayers in a very

unexpected way: through a terrible Sawi war.

The women were sounded the war alarm. “Boom, boom, boom” they beat on trees with long sticks. A Haeman boy called a man named Ama, from the Sawi village of Kamur, a “lizard skin.” Ama was furious. Soon the air was filled with war cries and arrows. It was war!

The war went on for months. Many men were hurt and killed. Don and Carol cared for the injured men and prayed that God would bring an end to the war. They begged Mahaen, Kani and the other warriors to stop the war, but each time the answer was “no.”

At last Tuan Don threatened to leave Haemen if the war did not end. Mahaen did not want his village to lose the medicines, tools and honor Tuan Don gave them. “Tomorrow, Tuan Don, the war will stop. We will have “cool water” (peace) tomorrow. I promise,” Mahaen told him. “Now I must go. There is much to do.”

Tuan Don watched Mahaen go, little guessing how much it would cost him to stop the war. He would have to give his son as a tarop tim---a peace child.

The next day, the warriors from each tribe faced each other in two long lines. The women and children gathered around, too. They all watched as Mahaen took Mani, his little baby son from his wife’s arms. She wailed and fell to the ground in sobs of sadness. A man named Kaiyo from Kamur brought his little son Biakadonm, too. The villagers from Haenam laid hands on little Mani. The villagers from Kamur laid hands on little Biakadon. Then the babies were given to a chosen man of the enemy tribe.

“As long as these peace children, Mani and Biakadon live, there will be peace between our tribes,” the warriors promised. A great cry of joy went up. The war was over. Peace had come at last.

Don and Carol were amazed at what they heard: fathers who gave their own, dearly loved sons to make peace with their enemies. Didn’t that sound like what God had done by giving Jesus? God had answered their prayers at last. He had given them the key to telling the Sawis the good news of salvation.

Tuan Don gathered warriors together in the man-house again, but this time He told them of Jesus, the peace child: “Myao Kodon loved His Son more than anyone else,” Don explained. “But He gave Him up to

be the peace child for all who would ever turn from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior. Come! Turn away from your sins! Trust in Jesus as your peace child!"

This time the warriors understood. The Holy Spirit worked powerfully in the Sawi who lived in Haenam and many other villages. Hundreds of Sawis, including Mahaen and Kani and the two peace children from the war, Biakodon and Mani, confessed their sins to Myao Kodon and trusted in Jesus as their own peace child (Savior). Today, many Sawis now travel to other parts of Irian Jaya and even other parts of the world to share the message of the God's love for sinners in sending His Son Jesus to save them.

Cracking the Case:

It's time to answer our Case Questions.

1. Who was at war? How did they make peace? Two Sawi tribes. They made peace by giving a son from the tribe to the other tribe. As long as the son lived, the peace was kept.

2. How did Don use the tribes' peace maker to tell the people about Jesus? He told them that Jesus was God's Son, the peace child sent to make peace between sinful people and God.

Something For You and Me

Our Bible Truth is:

God Showed the Depths of His Love By Giving His Son Jesus to Save His People

Our Bible Verse is: 1 John 4:10:

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

What about you and me? It is easy to see how different we are from the Sawis, but do we see we are very much like them, too? Don't we have hearts that rebel against God? Don't we need Jesus to be the peace child that brings us to God? We do! Let's praise God for giving us His Son to make peace between Him and us. Let's ask Him to help us to see our sins and turn and trust in Jesus. Let's ask Him to help us bravely spread this wonderful message to others.

Closing ACTS Prayer

A God, we praise You for being the Great Lover and Savior of Your undeserving people. People who were at war with You by being sinners, but whom You have loved and wanted to make Your dearly loved people.

C God, we confess that we all are enemies with You, by nature. We all deserve Your punishment for rebelling against You and Your good ways. We need a Savior to make peace between You and us.

T God, we thank You for answering Your people's prayers to help them tell others the good news of Jesus. Thank You for sending Jesus to make peace and forgiveness of sins possible.

S God, work in our hearts that we might turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. Send out Your people to every part of the world, that all might hear and believe the good news of Jesus.

Irian Jaya: A large, island country in the Pacific Ocean.

God Showed the Depths of His Love By Giving His Son Jesus to Save His People

God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Three persons, but just one God. God could live forever happy, in the wonderful, perfect fellowship of love He has within Himself. He has never needed anything or anyone to be complete.

No, God didn't need anyone else to love, yet He chose to create people with a heart to know and love Him. He wanted to share Himself with these people--especially His people: all those who would ever turn and trust in Jesus as their Savior.

But even before He created the world, even before He created them, God knew that His love would be very, very costly. All people--including His people-- would rebel against Him. They would break fellowship with Him. They would deserve His punishment, not His love. Only a huge act of love on His part would rescue them. And right then, before the beginning, God chose to make it!

He chose to give His one, dear Son Jesus to take the punishment for their sins. So at just the right time, Jesus left the wonderful, perfect fellowship with God the Father and Holy Spirit in heaven and came to earth to live as a man. He lived the perfect life needed to please God. On the cross, He offered it up as the perfect sacrifice for sin. He took all the terrible punishment for the sins of God's people so they could be forgiven. Because of Jesus, they would get to know God and delight in His wonderful love.

God has shown His love for His people in many ways, but the greatest way He has shown His love is by giving Jesus to save them. We can become God's people when we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

Understanding the Bible Truth

1. In whose love is God perfectly happy in? *His love for Himself: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.*
2. How do the Father, Son and Holy Spirit live together? *In the closest of fellowship, always delighting in each other; never needing anyone or anything else to be happy.*
3. Who did God chose to love with His very great love? How did He show His love? *Sinful people. He chose to save them by giving up His own Son Jesus to pay for their sins.*
4. Why didn't people deserve God to save them? *All people were created to know and love Him, yet they all chose to rebel against Him and live their own way. They deserved death, not for God to save them.*
5. What was so hard about what the Father chose to do? *He gave up the deepest, dearest closeness of fellowship with His Son. He crushed Him with full punishment for the sins of His people.*
6. What was so hard about what Jesus chose to do? *He gave up the deepest, dearest closeness of fellowship with His Father (and the Holy Spirit). He chose to live among sinful people in this sinful world as not just the Son of God but as a human. He chose to bear all the terrible suffering on the cross for God's people.*
7. Whose sins does God forgive? *All who confess their sins to God, turn away from their sinful lives and trust in Jesus as their own Savior.*
8. What will God's people get to enjoy? *Knowing God; delighting in His love now and always.*
9. What is the greatest way God has shown His love for His people? *Sending Jesus to save them from their sins when He suffered and died on the cross.*
10. How can we become God's people, dearly loved? *By turning away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.*

Bible Truth Story Connection Questions

1. How did Tuan Don tell the Sawis about the depths of God's love by giving Jesus? *Tuan Don explained to the Sawis about God's great love for sinful people by telling them that Jesus was the dearly loved Son that God gave to be the once for all time peace child who wouldn't just to live among His enemies, but to be killed as the atoning sacrifice for their sins.*
2. Why could Mahaen especially understand about God's love in giving His Son Jesus? *Because he had given up his own son, Mani, to be the peace child from his village.*

Bible Verse Connection Question

1. What does our Bible Truth have to do with our **Bible Verse: 1 John 4:10**: "This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.?"

God loved His Son most of all, yet He loved His people so much that He chose to send Him to be the atoning sacrifice for sins that they needed. How deep is the love of God that He would do this for them!

Life Application Questions

1. Can we become God's dearly loved adopted children? *Yes! When we confess our sins to God; turn from them; and trust in Jesus as our own Savior.*

2. How should God's people want to live when they understand God's love for them shown through Jesus? *They should want to be thankful to God each day for what He has done for them. They should want to obey Him and please Him in everything they do. They should realize that no matter what happens to them each day, they have every reason to shout for joy to the LORD for all He has done for them... and the wonderful riches of His love forever they have to look forward to when they go to live with Him after they die.*

ACTS Questions

1. What is something we can praise God for from this Bible Truth? *Praise God for being willing to give up His precious Son to save His people.*

2. What is something we can confess to God from this Bible Truth? *Confess ways that we have rebelled and disobeyed Him, not wanting to know Him and His love. We deserve His punishment. We need a Savior!*

3. What is something we can thank God for from this Bible Truth? *Thank God for choosing to love us, even though we have treated Him so terribly.*

4. What is something we can ask God for from this Bible Truth? *We can ask God to work in our hearts that we would want to turn away from disobeying Him and trust in this wonderful Jesus as our own Savior. Ask God to help us to understand more of how great His love is and help us to love Him.*

The Gospel

1. How has God shown the depths of His love for His people? What is the gospel?

God is the good Creator and King of the world. He made people to worship Him and live by His good laws. But we are all sinners who have rebelled against Him. We all deserve death--God's just, eternal punishment for our sins. How terrible! But God has good news for us. In His great mercy, God sent His Son Jesus to earth to save sinners. Yes, Jesus, the perfect Son of God, left His home in heaven and became a man. He lived the perfect life that pleases God. (He's the only one who has ever done that!) He offered it up to God His Father as the perfect sacrifice for sins when He suffered and died on the cross. Then, on the third day, Jesus rose from the dead in victory. He had fully paid for the sins of God's people, so they wouldn't have to! Now all who turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior will receive forgiveness of sins and eternal life with God. They will be His very own special people who will know Him and enjoy Him forever. We can be God's people, too, if we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus as our own Savior.

Game: Sit Ball

Materials

Two or Three soft baseball sized balls. Or, could use beach balls
Bible Truth Questions

Preparing the Game

1. Choose 20+ questions for your game from the Bible Truth Discussion Questions, or make up your own.
2. Write the Bible Truth questions on small thin strips of paper (or make a photocopy of the Bible Truth Discussion Questions and simply cut them into strips) and put them in the bag/bowl.

Playing the Game

Have children sit in a circle on the ground, with about 2' spacing. Give them two or three soft indoor baseballs and are to throw them from one to another, avoiding "It" who is moving around trying to catch one. When a ball is caught, the child who threw the ball chooses a question for the class to answer. If correctly answered, the player becomes the new "It". If not, then the old "It" remains in place.

Game continues as number of questions, time, and attention span allow.

Optional TAKING IT TO OTHERS Activity: Quiz Questions

Have the children choose a few of the questions from the game to ask the parents/other children during TAKING IT TO OTHERS time. Help pre-readers by whispering the question in their ear and letting them ask it aloud to the parents/other children. Make sure you read the Bible verse aloud before you ask your questions.

Directions:

1. Write words to song in large print before class.
2. Play the song for the children, helping them follow along on the song sheet.
3. Discuss the song, using a few questions from the discussion sheet. *Don't use them all!*
4. Introduce sign language for key words of your choice from sign language sheet for your song. Use as few or as many as you think the children can learn.
5. Sing and sign the song. Sign language as well as large format lyrics and sheet music are found in the PFI Unit Songbook or online.
6. If desired, play the Song Game.

Optional TAKING IT TO OTHERS Activity: Presenting and Singing the Song

1. Sing and sign the song, encouraging the watching children/parents to join in.
2. Ask the class some of the questions listed below. The Bible Truth Connection Question is particularly good to help them understand how the song ties in with the Bible Truth.

Understanding the Song

1. What great things has God done that we should glory Him? *He has sent His Son Jesus to be the Way for sinners to come to God.*
2. How did God show how much He loved the world? *He gave His very own Son to come and suffer a terrible death to pay for the sins of His people.*
3. What does "atonement" mean? *Making peace with someone after being enemies.*
4. What does it mean that Jesus yielded His life as an atonement for sin? *To yield one's life means to give it up. Jesus gave up His life to pay for the sins of His sinful people so that there would be peace between God and them.*
5. What is a lifegate? *A lifegate is a made up word that means the way to eternal life with God.*
6. Who may have eternal life? *All may go in. Anyone who turns from their sins and trusts in Jesus as the payment for their sins may be saved.*
7. Why should the people rejoice and praise the Lord? *Because Jesus has made the way to the Father.*
8. How do we come to the Father? *Through faith in Jesus the Son's payment for our sins.*

Bible Truth Connection Question

1. How does this song relate to our **Bible Truth: God Showed the Depths of His Love by Giving His Son, Jesus, to Save His People?** *We give glory to God for giving us His Son who He loved so much to be the payment for sins. Sinners could never pay for their sins. Only by Jesus giving up His life in the place of sinners could there ever be a way for them to come to the Father.*

Story Connection

1. How does this song relate to our story? *How does this song relate to today's story? When Tuan Don told the Sawis that God so loved the world that He gave His own Son to be the once and for all peace child between Him and sinners, they finally understood the good news of salvation. The Holy Spirit started to work in their hearts and many confessed their sins and accepted Jesus as the peace child, the Lifegate to eternal life with God. They praised God and gave Him the glory for this great gift.*

Bible Connection Question

1. What does this hymn have to do with our Bible Verse: **1 John 4:10**: "This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.?"

All of God's people are sinners. There is no reason that God should love them because of their own goodness. But God still loved them. He chose to save them through His Son Jesus. He sent Him to be an atoning sacrifice for their sins when He died on the cross. And Jesus did it! He took all the punishment for their sins! He opened the Lifegate so all could go in. We give God the glory for doing this, because He is the one who alone could do and did do it! How great is His love for His people!

Life Application Questions

ACTS Questions

1. What is something we can praise God for from this hymn?

Praise God for being the Provider of the Lifegate of salvation for His people.

2. What are sins we can confess to God from this hymn?

That many times we hardly even remember to thank God for all He has done through Jesus.

3. What is something we can thank God for from this hymn?

We can thank God that He did not give His people what they deserved, but instead gave them life through Jesus.

4. What is something we can ask God for from this Bible Verse?

That God would work in our hearts that we might turn from our sins and trust Jesus as our Savior. We can ask Him to help us rejoice in Him each day as we remember what He has done for His sinful people.

Meditation Version: 1 John 4:10

Understanding the Bible Verse

Bible Truth Connection Question

Game: Scrambled Eggs

Materials

Bible Verse written up in large print so that all can see
 Plastic Hollow Easter Eggs, 10 of one color for each team
 Pen and paper
 2 carpet squares or other base marker

Preparing the Game

1. Clearly print out the words to the verse on paper and cut it into 10+ sections. Number each section in sequence. Place each section in Easter eggs of the same color. Print out another copy of the verse, also numbered sequentially on another piece of paper. Repeat for each team.
2. Hide the eggs around the classroom. Place the two carpet squares down in opposite ends of the classroom.

Learning the Verse

Some or all of your children may be non- or early readers. Teach the verse in sections, having them say it after you. Repeat a few times. Add clapping or other movement as they say it.

Directions

1. If desired, lead the children in a discussion of a **FEW** of the most important questions before beginning game.
2. Explain the game to them as follows:
 Have the children form two teams seated at their bases. Give each team a written out copy of the verse and place it on their base. Assign each team a particular color of Easter egg and tell them that pieces to the verse are hidden in eggs around the room. They are to find all their eggs, remove the verse section from the egg and put it in order. They can use the copy of the verse (and numbers on each section—especially helpful for pre- and early readers) to help them put it in order. The first team to find all the verse, put it in order and recite it as a group wins.

Game continues until all the eggs have been found or as time allows.

Non-competitive Option

Don't split the children into teams. Use any color Easter egg for the pieces of the verse. Hide them around the room. Have the children take turns finding an egg and bringing it back to the group. Have the child open the egg and read (or have you read) the word/s on the piece of paper. Stick them in place on the copy of the verse. If desired, have the children say the verse each time before each "hunt", reinforcing the verse.

Optional TAKING IT TO OTHERS Activity: Quiz Questions

Have the children choose a few of the questions from the game to ask the parents/other children during TAKING IT TO OTHERS time. Help pre-readers by whispering the question in their ear and letting them ask it aloud to the parents/other children. Make sure you read the Bible verse aloud before you ask your questions.

Directions:

1. Write words to song in large print before class.
2. Play the song for the children, helping them follow along on the song sheet.
3. Discuss the song, using a few questions from the discussion sheet. *Don't use them all!*
4. Introduce sign language for key words of your choice from sign language sheet for your song. Use as few or as many as you think the children can learn.
5. Sing and sign the song. Sign language as well as large format lyrics and sheet music are found in the PFI Unit Songbook or online.
6. If desired, play the Song Game.

Optional TAKING IT TO OTHERS Activity: Presenting and Singing the Song

1. Sing and sign the song, encouraging the watching children/parents to join in.
2. Ask the class some of the questions listed below. The Bible Truth Connection Question is particularly good to help them understand how the song ties in with the Bible Truth.

4 Large pieces of paper and a Marker
Masking Tape
Four small pieces of paper
Cup or bag
Story Review Questions
Optional: Team Pennies to differentiate each team

Preparing the Game

1. Make up story review questions that answer the questions: Why? What? How? What would you do? You will want to have 20+ questions. Many of the Story Review Discussion Questions can be modified to fit one of these four questions.
2. Make a stop sign and a green light out of the red and green construction paper and tape them each to the end of a ruler.
3. Make four signs out of the paper: Why? What? How? What would you do? Tape these signs in 4 different locations, such as corners of the room.
4. Write these 4 names also on four small pieces of paper of equal size and place in the cup/bag.

Playing the Game

Divide the children into two teams. At the leader's signal, all the children will run to one of the four signs and place their hand on it or near it. When leader yells "Freeze" then the children must stay at their station. The leader then pulls one of the pieces of paper out of the cup and asks the children at that particular station a Story Review question. If they get it right, then they gain as many points as children from that team who were at that station. Play then resumes again.

Game continues as number of questions, time, and attention span allow.

Non-competitive Option

Don't split into teams. Simply ask the children at the particular station the question and let them work together to answer it.

Optional TAKING IT TO OTHERS Activity: Quiz Questions

Have the children choose a few of the questions from the game to ask the parents/other children during TAKING IT TO OTHERS time. Help pre-readers by whispering the question in their ear and letting them ask it aloud to the parents/other children.

CASE REPLAY ACTIVITIES

Use this guide to review the Case Story and act it out for others to enjoy!

CASE REPLAY, JR: YOUNGEST CHILDREN

Description: The children will act out the story together, everyone doing the same action/sound effect at the same time. This activity is most suitable for kindergarteners.

Materials

The Case RePlay, Jr. script for younger children

Preparation

1. Read through the script and write in the blanks along the side possible actions/sound effects the children could do to act it out.

Instructions

1. Tell the children that they will be re-enacting the story together as you tell it.
2. As you read the script, lead the children in actions/sound effects to do with you.
3. If desired, you can read the script and stop at certain sentences and ask them what a good action/sound effect would be to act out what you just read.
4. Repeat the re-enactment one or two times more.

CASE REPLAY, SR: OLDER CHILDREN

Description: The children act out the story as a three-scene play. You will narrate it using the Case RePlay, Sr. script and they will act it out (no spoken words, for the most part), with each child assuming a different character's role. This activity is most suitable for first grade and up. You will review the story, then practice it a few times before performing it for others.

Materials

The Case RePlay, Sr. script
White board or other large format paper
Costumes and props

Preparation

1. Prepare for the play by choosing costumes and props for each character in the story. Decorate the area with any scenery props.
2. Write the words "Beginning," "Middle," "End" on a large piece of paper/whiteboard with plenty of space under each heading. You will use this paper to help the children think about the story as a three-scene play, as it is presented in the script.

Instructions

1. Tell the children that they will get to act out the story as a three-scene play, with a beginning, middle and end section. Tell them that before they can act it out, they need to think it out. as you narrate it with your script.
2. Take the children's answers as they recount the story, helping them put key incidents in the right order.
3. If desired, when they have filled in their Beginning, Middle, End, read through your whole (real) script, so they hear exactly what you will have them act out.
4. Then tell the children that it's time to practice acting out the story.
5. Assign parts to each child. If you are using costumes, do NOT give them out at this point. They will be a distraction.
6. Have all the children sit on the floor or in chairs on one side of the "stage," then call the characters up in place as their part in the story comes.
7. As you read the script, guide the children in where you want them to move or do to act it out.
8. After going through the whole script once, give out any costumes and props and act out the script once or twice more.

Optional TAKING IT TO OTHERS Activity: Re-enacting the Story

Read the script as the children act out together (younger) or assuming different roles (older) as the other children or the parents watch.

Materials

 4 yards of yellow crepe paper streamers per child
 Stapler(s)
 Markers
 Sticky backed Velcro, 1" per child
 Scissors

Preparing the Craft

1. Cut out waistbands 4" x 28" (length of poster board) out of poster board, one per child.
2. Fold waistbands in half down long side.
3. Place crepe paper strips so that 1 end touches fold on poster board. Staple down. Repeat until crepe paper strips cover the whole length of the poster board waistband.
4. Fold down top of waistband over the stapled crepe paper. Staple along bottom of waistband to secure.

NOTE: Children may very well be able to do steps 3-4 as part of the craft, if you want. You could have them glue the crepe paper strips in place, then fold and staple down the belt.


Making the Craft

1. Show the sample of the craft you have made.
2. Have the children color the waistbands with their names or any designs.
3. Attach Velcro onto each end of the waistband and fit to size.
4. You can also have the children cut the crepe paper into small widths by cutting up the middle of each piece. Youngest children might find this very difficult.

Optional **TAKING IT TO OTHERS** Activity: Craft Presentation

If you are presenting the craft to other children or parents the children can hold up their crafts (or your model craft) and read their Bible Truth Connection answers to explain the importance of the craft.

CASE CRAFT**Discussion Guide****Instructions:**

As the children are settled into making their craft, ask them these questions to help them understand the craft's significance. Use the answers provided to guide the children's answers.

Discussion Questions

1. Where did Tuan Don tell the story of Jesus to the warriors of Haenam village? *In their smoky, man-house.*

2. Who did he tell them Jesus was? *The peace child God sent to make peace with His enemies, sinful people.*

3. Why did Tuan Don call Jesus the peace child? What did he hope this would do?
The idea of a peace child was something that the Sawi understood already. He hoped that they could understand the gospel this way.

4. What is Bible Truth that we are learning?
God Showed the Depths of His Love By Giving His Son Jesus to Save His People.

5. What does our craft have to do with our Bible Truth: God Showed the Depths of His Love By Giving His Son Jesus to Save His People?
Many Sawi warriors trusted in Jesus when they understood how great God's love was to send His Son to be the once and only peace child between sinful people and Himself.

6. What can our craft help us remember?
Like the Sawi warriors, we are sinners who need to trust in Jesus, God's peace child so that we can have eternal life.

TAKING IT TO OTHERS**Craft Presentation****Instructions:**

Have children hold up your model craft/their crafts. Choose five children (or you say) the five sections below to explain the craft's importance.

Presentation:

1. Our craft is: The Sawi Warriors.

2. In the smoky, man-house in Haenam village, Tuan Don told the story of Jesus, the peace child, to the warriors, hoping they could understand the good news of salvation this way.

3. Our Bible Truth is: God Showed the Depths of His Love By Giving His Son Jesus to Save His People.

4. Many Sawi warriors trusted in Jesus when they understood how great God's love was to send His Son to be the once and only peace child between sinful people and Himself.

5. Our craft can help us remember that like the Sawi warriors, we are sinners who need to trust in Jesus, God's peace child so that we can have eternal life.

Note: Even non-readers can participate in presenting the craft, if you will whisper what they are to say in their ear and let them say it aloud for the others to hear.

BEFORE CLASS:**1. PICK YOUR PERSON**

VIPPs can be anyone in your church! Typically, they fall into 6 categories: Church staff, Elders, Deacons/deaconesses, Special Volunteers (people who aren't paid, but spend a lot of time helping out in particular ways), Supported Workers (a.k.a. missionaries), and Church Members.

2. GATHER YOUR FACTS

Use the VIPP Information Sheet to write down the facts about your VIPP. The information on this worksheet is used in the VIPP activities, listed in the "Choose an Activity" section below.

DURING THE ACTIVITY:**1. INTRODUCE YOUR VIPP**

Introduce your VIPP to the children, using the VIPP Information Sheet. Fill in a set of VIPP Clue Cards with the information for your VIPP. If desired, you can even have the actual person come into class for the children to meet.

Need help describing what someone does for the church in a kid-friendly way? Click on the list of common VIPPs and how to describe what they do to kids. See if your VIPP is one of these. It may save you some time.

2. PRAY!

Lead the children in praying for the VIPP. Ask the children if they would like to pray for one of the VIPPs prayer requests. Even non-readers can pray for the VIPP if you whisper the prayer request in their ear, then let them say it aloud. Never force a child to pray!

3. CHOOSE AN ACTIVITY

There are two activities you can use to help the children learn about the VIPP:

VIPP Clue Cards: These are 9 coloring sheets in which children fill in the 9 things they learn about the VIPP from the VIPP Information Sheet. Photocopy a set of each child. Use as few or as many of these Clue Cards as you desire.

VIPP Game: This is a game that uses a set of Clue Cards for one or two VIPPs.

Choose a VIPP and fill in his/her information on the VIPP Information Sheet. Fill in a set of VIPP Clue Cards with the information for your VIPP. Tell the children about the VIPP, having them fill in the VIPP Clue Cards with the key facts as they learn them. Write any words the children need to write on a white-board or other piece of paper so they can see how to spell them. Help younger children write these words on their clue cards. Ideas for how to tell the children about many common VIPPs are listed at praisefactory.org with the resources for this Bible Truth.

Optional TAKING IT TO OTHERS Activity: Introduce and Pray for the VIPP

If you are presenting the VIPP to other children or parents you can assign children to hold up the 10 clue cards and say what each card tells about the VIPP. (Or, you can have the children hold them up as you tell what each one means.) Then lead the children in praying for the VIPP.

Game: Picture Run

Materials

Information for two VIPPs

2 Sets of Clue Cards

Tape

Different color construction paper for each picture.

Preparing the Game

1. Fill in one set of clue sheets for each VIPP you are using.
2. Put all the Clue Cards in a bag, except for the ones with the names and pictures of the VIPPs.
3. Use tape to put up the pictures of each VIPP on a piece of construction paper. Tape each up in a different location/wall around the room.

Playing the Game

Reveal: Tell the children about the VIPPs, showing them your filled-in clue cards as you tell about them.

Review: Put the Clue Cards for the VIPPS put in a bag. Mix up. Have children stand together in middle of the room. Tell them that you will pull out a clue card, show it to them, and they are to run to the picture of the person who it belongs to. Give them the answer after everyone has run to their guessed person. Continue until all clues have been used up. (If you have a slick floor, you may want to avoid running. Make it fun by giving them a different way to go to each picture, such as skip or hop.)
