Unit 8: The God Who Loves

Big Question and Answer: "What is God's love for His people like? It's more than they could ever deserve!"

Bible Verse: "Give thanks to the LORD for He is good. His steadfast love endures forever." 1 Chronicles 16:34

Bible Truth 6 Concept: God Will Never Stop Loving His People

Our love for others often changes. Sometimes it is strong; sometimes it is weak. Sometimes it fades away completely. God's love for His people never changes. The Bible calls God's love "hesed:" steady love and kindness, flowing out to sinful people who don't deserve it.

God loved His people before they were created. He kept on loving them when they rebelled against Him. And He chose to send His dear Son, Jesus to save them from their sins. God will go on loving them forever and ever.

Why does God's love for His people never change? It's not because His people are so good and lovable. It's because God loves His people through Jesus, the perfect Son of God, who died for their sins. With His blood, shed on the cross, Jesus made a covenant—a forever promise—with God, His Father. His blood would be the perfect payment for the sins of God's people. He took God's punishment for their sins so they didn't have to bear it themselves.

Because of Jesus, God would forgive them and love them forever. Praise God for sending Jesus! He is why God will never stop loving His people.

It will never, ever end. It truly is more than they could ever deserve.

2. DIGGING DEEP DOWN: Key Concept and Story (introduce the Bible Truth and tell the related story)**Bible Truth 6**

"It's time for us to dig down deeper for answers to our Big Question. We're learning **SIX** Bible Truths that all tell us something about God's love for His people. We have learned some already. Can you remember what they are? (God Blesses All People with Many Good Gift; ; God Loved His People Before They Loved Him; God Showed the Depths of His Love By Giving His Son Jesus to Save His People; God Loves His People by Caring for Their Needs; and, God Uses Everything in His People's Lives for Their Good and His Glory.)

The Bible Truth we are going to be thinking about today is:

God’s people praise God for being the King of love. They delight in having Him as their king because all that He does comes from His heart of love for them that will never end or fail. God takes care of His people like a good shepherd cares for his sheep. Sheep are very stupid and need someone to take care all of their needs or else they will die. God promises to always be with His people, taking care of them throughout their whole length of days--their whole lives. And He will go on caring for them even after they die. He will take them to live with Him in heaven forever. How wonderful that will be! No wonder God’s people want to sing His praise forever! We can become God’s people when we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

Bible Truth 6 Bible Verse and Song

Romans 8:31-21,35,37-39

“If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all--how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?...No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any power, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

God’s people may have to go through some very hard things in this life, but they know that none of these things will ever separate them from God. He has always loved them and will always love them. He will be with them, helping them through them all, to the very end. And one day, God will bring them into heaven where they will enjoy His love and the delight of His presence forever.

"Now it's time for today's story called: **The Case of the Willful Wife.**

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. Who married the willful wife? Why? What did she do that was so bad?

2. Who was the willful a picture of? Who was her faithful husband a picture of? (If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

1. Who married the willful wife? Why? What did she do that was so bad? The prophet Hosea married Gomer because the LORD told him to. She left her husband for other men.

2. Who was the willful a picture of? Who was her faithful husband a picture of? Gomer was a picture of Israel, the LORD's unfaithful people who worshiped other gods, even though they had made a covenant to worship Him. Hosea was a picture of the LORD, who kept forgiving and loving His people, even though they didn't deserve it.

Close in prayer. (prayer suggestions included at end of story)

LESSON 2 STORY

Story of the Saints:

The Case of the Giant Joy

"Now it's time for today's story called: **The Case of the Giant Joy.**

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. Who came to know Giant Joy? What did the joy come from?

2. How did joy help her through her whole life? What did she look forward to? (If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)

Read story.

After reading story, ask for the children's answers to the questions.

1. Who came to know Giant Joy? What did the joy come from?

Sarah Edwards. From knowing God and enjoying His fellowship in her heart, by the Holy Spirit.

2. How did joy help her through her whole life? What did she look forward to?

Even when things were very hard, the joy of knowing God helped her to endure the hard things in the way that God wanted her to. She knew that one day she would go to be with God and live in His presence forever. There, she would be wonderfully happy, knowing and enjoying Him more fully than ever she would in life here on earth.

Close in prayer. (prayer suggestions included at end of story)

The Case of the Forward-Lookers <i>Acts 17,18; 1 and 2 Thessalonians</i>	<p>“Now it’s time for today’s story called: The Case of the Forward-Lookers.</p> <p>As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Who were the Forward-Lookers? What were they going through that was hard? 2. What were they looking forward to? How did this help them with what they endured? <p><i>(If desired, write these questions on a sheet of paper to refer to when the story is finished.)</i></p> <p><i>Read story.</i></p> <p><i>After reading story, ask for the children’s answers to the questions.</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Who were the Forward-Lookers? What were they going through that was hard? The Christians in Thessaloniki and Paul. They were suffering for being Christians. 2. What were they looking forward to? How did this help them with what they endured? The day when they would go to be with God in heaven. There would be no suffering then. They would enjoy His presence and His love in a far deeper way forever.
